'Idea-Generating Class' Nazareth Graduates 161

An "idea-generating, new breed kind of class" of 161 graduates received their diplomas under leader rites in Nazareth College's 37th commencement exercises Sunday afternoon.

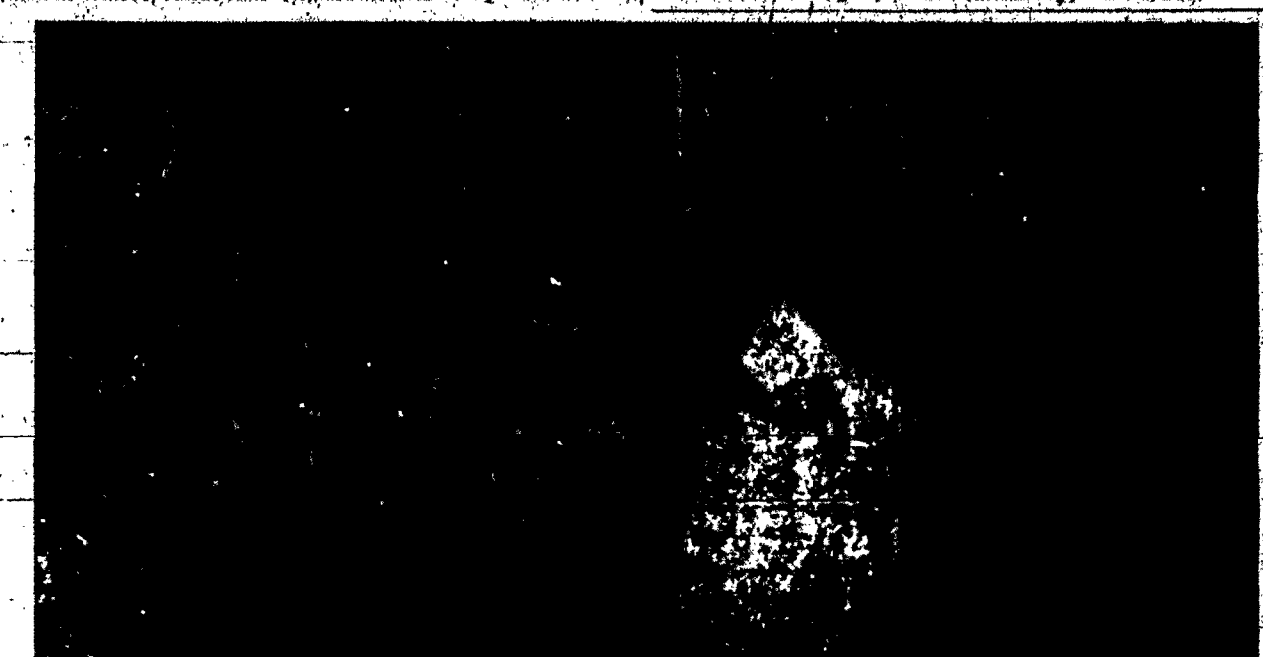
Sister Helen Daniel, college president, so described the young women as she laid them farrow.

Bishop Kearney, who gave the graduates their diplomas, said: "This is not the first time someone has left Nazareth. Centuries ago, a young man took his leave from the first Nazareth to go to His work but he never forgot Nazareth. At the journey's end, in the last moment of His life, the name Nazareth was written over His head.

"WHEN YOUR work is done, may the end of the story be the same," said the Bishop. "You know what God expects of you because of your years here at this Nazareth," he told the graduates, "and may the Pietà of Michelangelo be the symbol of your goal — to conclude your life's journey in the arms of Mary."

At their baccalaureate Mass Sunday morning, the text of Mary the Queen, Bishop Kearney said "ill-advised champions of the ecumenical movement" have attempted to "dethrone our Lady and take away her majesty." He told the graduates to "keep Mary always as the Queen of your hearts."

COMMENCEMENT speaker John P. Lomenzo, New York Secretary of State, said to the graduates, "This is not just a time for civil rights. It is a time for moral righteousness. By your example and out of your wisdom, it will become your responsibility to elevate the moral climate, to broaden the opportunities, to enhance

Father Hastings

Following is the text of the eulogy given by Rev. John J. Realy at the funeral Mass for Rev. Leo E. Hastings at Sacred Heart Cathedral Tuesday, May 26. Father Hastings died Saturday, May 23, 1964.

"I have glorified Thee on earth; I have finished the work which Thou gavest me to do." St. John 17:4.

The office that is mine this morning is not an easy one. Father Hastings was my classmate and my friend. Our friendship began about 44 years ago at St. Andrew's Seminary.

We, who then knew him so well were impressed with his singleness of purpose. He came from St. Peter and Paul parish to St. Andrew's to give himself entirely to the cause of Christ. Because of that, his eleven years of preparation for the priesthood at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminary were always marked by hard, earnest and constant application to the development of his spiritual and intellectual resources.

He never spared himself, all in his efforts to mold himself and to be molded into a saint. He will never again assist fitting candidate for the priesthood of Jesus Christ against He will never again preach to the day when his Bishop would you. He will never again teach call him to that high office. It you in the classroom. He is of it true to say that since the day another, a better world that call came on June 6, 1931.

When Bishop John Francis O'Hern ordained Leo Hastings a priest, until this last Saturday when Christ, the great high priest, called him to Himself, this singleness of devotion to Christ and to the Church of Christ shone forth from him like a radiant star. Truly, last Saturday, when he went before the throne of God, he could say: "I have glorified Thee on earth; I have finished the work Thou gavest me to do."
