Aquinas Institute's collection of trophies and gold medals continued to grow last Saturday. With Randy Block running a 22.1 anchor, the Irish defended their 880 relay title with a 1:33.5 victory in the eighth-annual American Legion Relays at Brighton High School field.

Block, who had a part in Aquinas' big win over McQuaid earlier in the week when he ran the 100-yard dash in ten seconds flat, used his customary finishing kick to beat East High's Tom Mills.

Going into the last turn in front of the jammed stands, Mills was on Block's heels. But the Irishman pulled away as they moved into the stretch.

Randy began his anchor leg with a two-yard lead, thanks to the efforts of Aquinas' runners, Dick Newman, Craig Zurkey and Tom Guerinot who combined to give the Little Irish a first place in the initial event of the day.

Aquinas went on to pile up 21 points to capture the Legion Relays for the second time in three years.

The Irish also came through with a big win in the shot put. A bevy quartet composed of Doug Burgess, Tom Hughes, Dick Mitrano and George Kerms propelled the iron sphere a total of 178 feet, 1/2 inch to place first ahead of Webster and Madison.

McQuaid Jesuit High School won the two-mile relay when Mike Connor, Pete Miller, Greg Sloan and Mike Shaughnessy took the event in 8:23. Aquinas' team of John Donovan, Barry McGee, Jerry Murray and Mike Popen came in second.

Award presentations were made by Charles E. Swartz, Monroe County American Consul, William Cox was chairman of the relay committee.
