Notre Dame Staff Members Receive Grants

Sister Mary Bernardine, R.S.M., of the faculty of Notre Dame High School, has been awarded a grant by New York State for special study at a Summer Institute in English at Nazareth College from June 24 to August 4. Sister received her B.A. degree from Nazareth in 1952 and has been a member of the English Department at Notre Dame High School for the past two years.

THIS GRANT makes a total of five received to date by members of the Notre Dame faculty for summer study. Other grants include: Dr. Dominic Rossi - National Science Foundation award for Summer Institute for High School Teachers of Science at Bucknell University; Sister Mary Carmella - National Science Foundation three-summer grant for study of advanced chemistry at Union College; Sister Mary Borromeo - National Defense Education Act grant for a seven-week intensive study of advanced French at Notre Dame University; Sister Mary Anne - National Defense Education Act grant for a six-week intensive study of German at Princeton University. All of these teachers are pursuing studies beyond the master's degree.

Other Notre Dame faculty members who are participating in summer study include the following: Sister Mary Joseph, who will attend a workshop for high school religion teachers at Fordham University from August 31 to September 4. Sister will make an intensive survey of new trends in the liturgy, catechetics and Bible study. Sister Mary Joseph received her M.A. in history from St. Bonaventure University in 1951.

Sister Mary Suzanne will study advanced history at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. this summer; Sister Marie Raymond will take courses leading to a degree in nursing education at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh; Sister Mary Sara will pursue studies in English and music at Marygrove College in Scranton, Pennsylvania.

Sister Mary Jane Frances, member of the science department at Notre Dame High School, will teach science this summer at Catherine McAuley College in Rochester. Sister received her Master of Science degree from Villanova University, and has been a member of Notre Dame's faculty since its opening in 1953.
