Two Sisters of Mercy received Master of Arts degrees in separate ceremonies Sunday, June 7. Mother Eymard Mistress of Novices, was awarded an M.A. degree in Latin, with a minor in Greek, from Catholic University.

Sister Mary Declan, chairman of the Social Studies department of Notre Dame High School, Elmira, was granted an M.A. degree in history by Niagara University. Both sisters are graduates of Nazareth College.

Mother Eymard's master thesis was a syntactical study of Pliny's Historia Naturalis, by means of which she attempted to prove that the works of Pliny form a transition between the Golden and Silver Ages of Classical Literature.

MOTHER EYMARD taught Latin and English at Our Lady of Mercy High School for sixteen years; from 1957 to 1961 she was Mistress of Postulants, at which time she became Mistress of Novices. She is a member of the Catherine McAuley College faculty, teaching in the field of Latin. Mother Eymard is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Stephen J. Hyland of 176 Alexander Street.

Sister Mary Declan pursued the subject of Franklin D. Roosevelt in the courts working in the Hyde Park archives in connection with her research for her master's thesis. Sister taught for seven years at Our Lady of Mercy High School before going to the Notre Dame faculty in 1959. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Donovan of 18 Warwick Ave.

### Katrina Davis Top Twirler

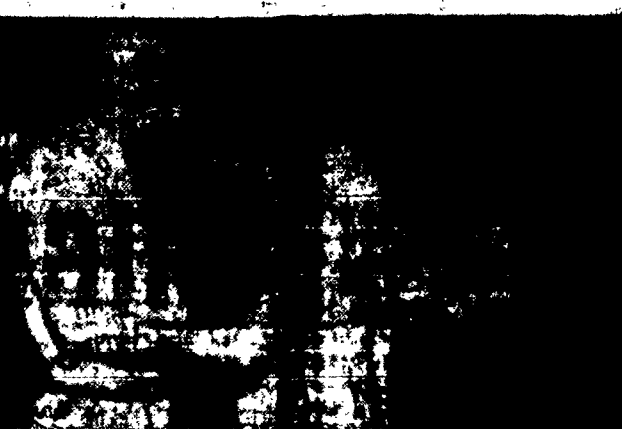
