Mississippi

Klan Pressure Mounts

Jackson Miss. — (NC) — Catholics in Mississippi are beginning to feel greater pressure applied by the revived and newly militant Ku Klux Klan in this state.

Klanism now number 81,000 here and are advertising for more native-born, white candidates to join their organization.

Excluded from membership are Catholics, Jews, Turks, Moslems, Tartars, Orientals, Negroes, or any other person whose background of culture is foreign to the Anglo-Saxon system of government by responsible, free, individual citizens.

According to a Klan circular, Catholics are excluded because "they bow to a Roman dictator in direct violation of the First Amendment, and the true American spirit of responsible, individual liberty."

Jews are similarly not acceptable "because they reject Christ, and through the new machinery of their international banking cartel, are at the root of our present economic depression of what we call 'communism' today."

Two publications, one of them Catholic, have felt the sting of Klan anger in recent weeks.

The Greenwood Commonwealth, a regular paper, was singled out for its editor's comment unfavorably on a series of Klan cross burnings in 64 Mississippi counties. A printed circular issued by an anonymous "local C.I.V.C. group" attacked the paper for its failure to "stand with Mississippians."

The same circular attacked the Center Light, a publication of the St. Francis Center in Greenwood. The center is operated by Fr. Christl, a group of laywomen who work with Negroes.

The circular declared that "this so-called newspaper is nothing but racial agitation in its truest form. Its sole purpose is to extol Negro candidates for public office and to announce integrated social affairs and report on their success."

The Klan circular continued: "It comes as no surprise that this group of people, who are responsible for this publication, use religion as a camouflage for their integration activity. This misuse of Christianity is time worn and in extremely poor taste . . ."

This experience consists of study and discussion of high school Red Cross organization and programs. It is one of two workshops operated each session by the Institute Eastern Division of education of the American Red Cross.

Students were designed to help participants selected for their leadership potential to learn leadership skills and techniques which will help them to play leading roles in Red Cross programs and service activities in their local chapters and communities.

Students will participate in demonstrations of first aid, water safety and home nursing. Fifty-three chapters in the East Central states will send delegates between the ages of 14 and 18 to this week-long course.

The group has helped materially with the making of over 500 pairs of resumes, collected 2,000 paperback books, and the girls have knitted handkerchiefs for the Leprosy and made skirts and blouses to outfit over 30 children in mission territories.

Corresponding with priests, brothers, sisters and students in foreign countries has helped start different projects to aid each individual's needs.

Trying to fulfill all the aims of Prayer, Work and Sacrifice as a National Organization, the C.S.M.C. has worked into the morning prayers a special remembrance for the missionaries and missions throughout the world along with remembering individual persons in each home-room.
