### Federal Aid To Hospitals Continued

Washington — (NC) — The House has passed and sent to the Senate a five year \$1,382,500,000 extension and expansion of the Hill-Burton program of aid for public or nonprofit hospital construction.

It would also specifically earmark funds for modernization of existing hospitals and health facilities, and would provide \$22.5 million over the next five years for half the costs of metropolitan or regional planning of health facilities.

The Hill-Burton program was first enacted in 1946. The present authorization expires June 30.

New York — (RNS) — President Johnson has lauded the forthcoming critical edition of the works of St. Thomas Aquinas as a "monumental service to the cultural and intellectual movements of our time."

He said its publication will "serve the scholars of all faiths" and "assist the spiritual and intellectual growth of not only our American people, but will be a definite contribution to world citizenship."

The President's commendation was sent to the St. Thomas Aquinas Foundation (STAF) here, organized by the Dominican Fathers of the U.S., which is sponsoring the critical edition of the famed 13th century theologian and philosopher.

### Paulist Fathers to Stress Civil Rights, Unity

New York — (RNS) — The Paulist Fathers' General Chapter decided here to give special emphasis in the society's apostolate to civil rights, the ecumenical movement, the laity and convert work.

These emphases will be in addition to the order's mass communication apostolate. It was reported by the Very Rev. John F. Fitzgerald, newly elected Superior General.

The universal Church, he said, "is conscious today of the growing need to share all its gifts, its experience, and so the Paulists wish to participate fully in the ideal by sharing their specialized mission exper-

ences." He said the Paulists will supply specialized personnel and techniques in the Church's ecumenical, social and convert apostolates in North and South America and abroad.

Father Fitzgerald said the Chapter endorsed Paulist participation, with approval of the local bishop, in appropriate civil rights demonstrations on behalf of minorities.

He noted that Paulist seminarians have been taking part with other Catholics, as well as Protestant and Jewish, theological students in the civil rights prayer-vigil at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C.

### Catholic Schools Said Flourishing

New Orleans — (RNS) — "Because of some unfortunate statements made by some individuals, confusion has been created about the state of Catholic education," Archbishop John R. Cody charged here.

To substantiate his opinion that Catholic education "never was so flourishing," he announced plans to build seven new high schools in the Archdiocese of New Orleans.

The Archbishop, who is also President-general of the National Catholic Education Association, said that never "were our Catholic people so desirous of increasing the number of

schools and improving the methods of teaching."

"For evidence of this," he added, "one need only read the Catholic papers of the archdioceses and dioceses around the country."

He said criticism of Catholic schools, even though "greatly unfounded, will serve to inspire us to even greater sacrifice to provide a thorough Catholic education for all our children."

Meanwhile Bishop Robert J. Dwyer, of Reno called Catholic education in the United States the "greatest achievement of private enterprise in the story of mankind."

At a meeting of the Catholic Parent-Teacher League in Cleveland, the Nevada prelate said Catholic schools had achieved a "significantly greater consistency of results than the state in

He said that while there is public system," were weaknesses in the Catholic schools no one had tried to hide them.

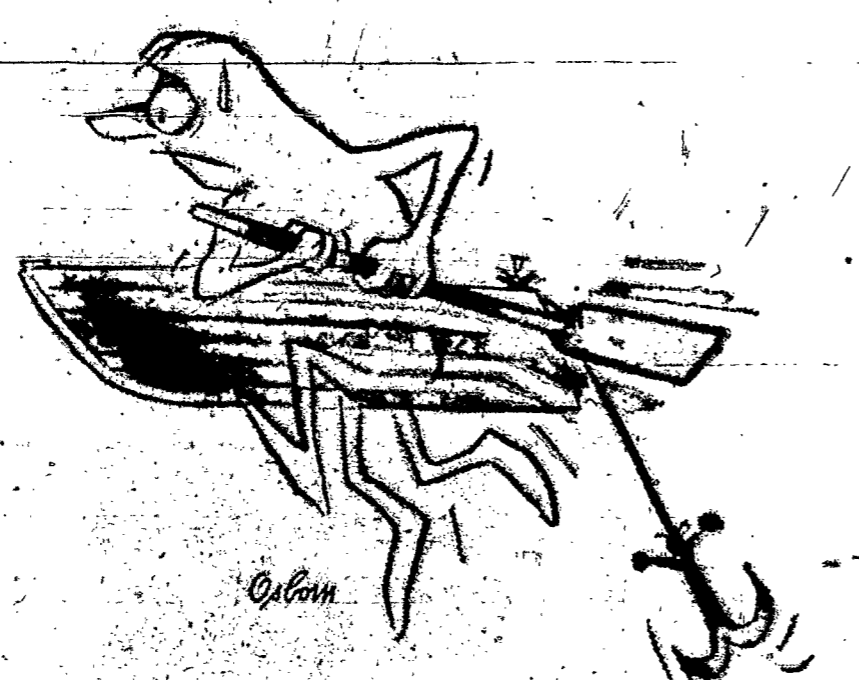
