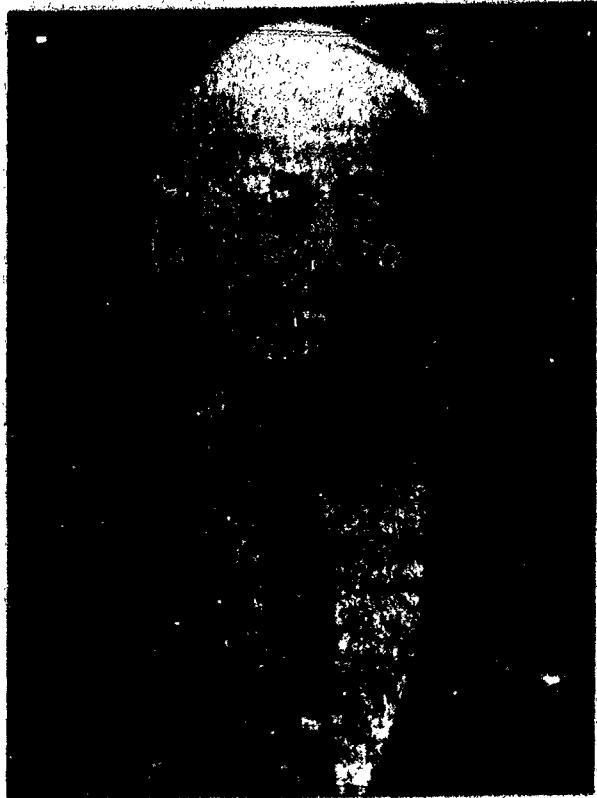


Knights of St. John Memorial Mass

The pageantry of a parade and the solemnity of religious ritual made a colorful and stirring spectacle at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery Sunday morning.

Bishop Kearney celebrated the annual memorial Mass for Knights of St. John.

Robed in the red vestments for Mass honoring St. John Fisher, the Bishop described the courage of the saint and of St. John the Baptist as a needed lesson for the twentieth century Knights who attended the Mass.



A veteran member of the Knights of St. John attended Sunday's memorial Mass at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

He is 82 year old William G. Knapp, Sr., 64 years a member of the Catholic fraternal order linked in its legends to the Crusader knights who fought for the sepulchre of the Lord in Jerusalem.

He is a member of St. Eustace Commandery 30 at St. Joseph's Church and lives at 228 Dewey St. in St. Augustine parish, Rochester.

Mr. Knapp said, "My uniform doesn't fit very well anymore. I haven't worn it in about five or six years."

But he proudly displays his Knights of St. John lapel pin and attends meetings "at least when it's time to pay my dues."

son for the twentieth century Knights who attended the Mass.

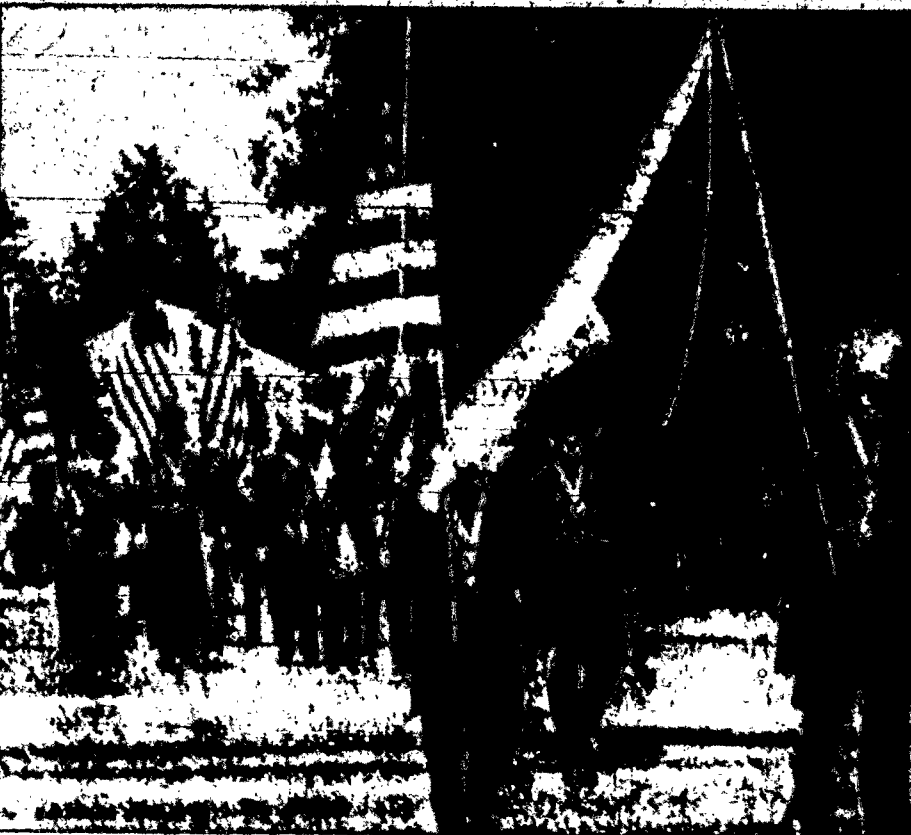
He said the Church's ritual for the consecration of a new altar requires placing the relics of saints in the altar tomb — a tradition traced by historians to the customs of Christians in the catacombs who held at their Masses at the tombs of martyrs.

"I can think of no more appropriate place to erect an altar for this annual Mass than here where are buried so many saints who loved and worshipped God, whose lives were directed so perfectly by the commandment of God to love the Lord and their neighbor with all their strength," the Bishop stated.

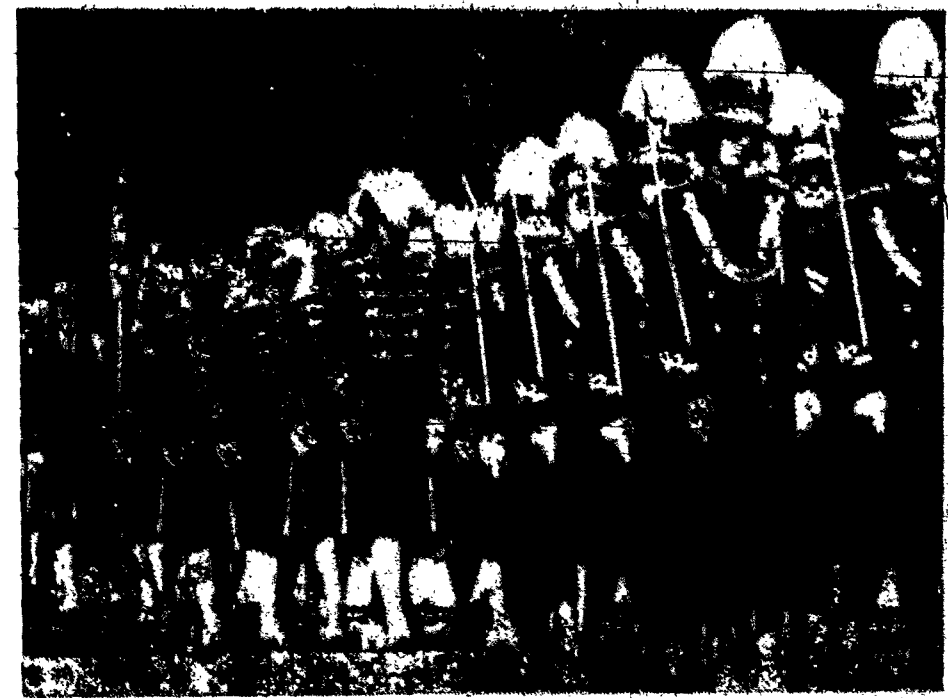
