Father McCormack, M.M. Marks 40 Priestly Years

Father Joseph P. McCormack, 1924, was to Fushun, China, finally into Shanghai. There he was a Maryknoll Missioner from Palmyra, recently celebrated the 40th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.

A VETERAN of 33 years mission work in the Orient, Father McCormack now serves as pastor for the Chinese population in Incheon, Korea. His first foreign mission assignment following his ordination on June 15, 1924, was to Fushun, China, where he was Society Superior for 12 years.

At the beginning of World War II, Father McCormack's mission was captured by the Japanese forces. He was repatriated aboard the S.S. Gripsholm in 1942, and served at Maryknoll stations in Chile until the end of the war.

Father McCormack returned to China in 1946, but several years later the Communist Army's advances forced him to withdraw into South China and

After five years in a Chinese prison, Father McCormack was released and spent the next two years lecturing, writing and recuperating from his ordeal in China. He returned to foreign mission work in Korea in the spring of 1950.

THE BROTHER of Edward McCormack of 418 E. Main St., Palmyra, Father McCormack was born in Ballaghaderreen, Ireland. He attended Catholic Col-

lege in Lisacul, Manorbey, Ireland, before coming to the United States. He entered Maryknoll in 1918 to study for the foreign missionary priesthood and was ordained at Maryknoll, N.Y., six years later.
