Corning Weddings **Joseph Libisch Requiem, World-Famed Engraver**

Corning—Miss Audrey Jean Box became the bride of Charles Patrick Sciorra of Bridgeport, Conn., Saturday, June 27, at 11 a.m. in St. Anthony's Church.

The Rev. William Burns officiated at the double ring ceremony and celebrated Nuptial Mass.

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Box of 221 E. Corning Road, Corning. Her husband's parents are Mr. and Mrs. Armando Sciorra of 412 W. Fifth St.

Mr. Box escorted his daughter to the altar.

Mrs. Nancy Bell of Hornell, was matron of honor for her sister, Miss Marilyn Tobey of Rochester and Miss Sandra Smith of Corning were bridesmaids.

Debbie Bell, niece of the bride, and Michael Sciorra, brother of the bridegroom, were flower girl and ring bearer.

Corning—Joseph Libisch, 77, of 102 W. Pultney St., recognized throughout the world as one of the finest glass engravers, and the man who engraved Steuben crystal glass pieces for the crown heads of Europe and Asia on formal occasions, died at his home June 21 following a lengthy illness.

The Rosary was recited at the Philips funeral home the following Tuesday evening, with Mass on Wednesday morning in St. Vincent de Paul's Church, and burial in St. Mary's Cemetery.

The retired Steuben Glass employe, who completed an engraving career in July 1950 that covered 37 years in Yugoslavia, Austria, Bohemia and the United States, engraved "The Merry-Go-Round Bowl" (which former President Truman gave to Queen Elizabeth as a wedding present), the Zodiac Bowl, the United Nations Bowl, and a number of bowls and vases which American presidents have given to governmental heads abroad.

Mr. Libisch was born in a small glass manufacturing town in southern Hungary on Nov. 10, 1885, the son of a skilled glasscutter. Later, his parents moved to Zvecco, another small glassmaking village in Yugoslavia, where his father took employment as a glasscutter.

There, at the age of 12, Joseph Libisch went to work as an apprentice glass engraver. After five years of intensive training, he completed his study and began his career. When he was 19 he went to Vienna and worked as a custom engraver for large department stores specializing in fine engraved glassware.

After working in Bohemia for a short time, Libisch came to America in April 1911 with \$22 in his pockets and a small suitcase with all his possessions, including two examples of his engraving work.

He came to Corning and joined the former Sinclair glass
