Funeral rites for Rev. Clement Killgoar, SS. CC. were held at St. Anthony's Church, Mattitohick, Mass., on June 26. Father Killgoar served in Rochester at Our Lady of Victory Church.

A native of Dorchester section of Boston, Father Killgoar was ordained in Washington, D.C. in May 1942. Following appointments as Seminary procurator in Wareham and Superior of Sacred Hearts Monastery, Fairhaven, Mass., he was transferred in 1949 to Ireland, where he spent two years establishing a House to train missionary priests.
