## Mary A Huddy Requiem Held

Miss Mary A. Huddy, 83, highly esteemed Rochester business woman at the time of her retirement as credit manager of the East State Board, died June 15, 1964, in St. Mary's Hospital.

Miss Huddy, of 948 Monroe Ave., was reversed by Rochester credit men as an outstanding work in executive. Beginning work in a grocery store in 1901, she joined the Edwards concern in 1908. Having served for some time as assistant credit manager, she was, in 1915, upon the death of the late William Malloy, named the store's credit manager, the post she held for 24 years before her retirement.

A MEMBER of the Rochester Association of Credit Managers, the Rochester Retail Credit Association, the Credit Women of Rochester, the Chamber of Commerce, the Professional Women's Association, the League of Mary and the Rosary Society of Blessed Sacrament Church, Miss Huddy was a past president of the National Retail Credit Association.

She was one of those responsible for the establishment of the local Credit Bureau, a source of centralized credit information; and among credit grantors of the area she was known as the Dean of Credit Managers. She survived by family three sisters, Sister Mary Anita of the Sisters of Mercy, Rochester; Mrs. Edward E. Driscoll, and Mrs. Agnes Paskal, both of Rochester; also by several nieces and nephews.

Funeral Mass for Miss Huddy was sung by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James C. McAniff, Vicar General in Old St. Mary's Church on Friday, June 19, 1964. Present in the sanctuary were the Very Rev. Msgr. Edward J. McAniff and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Arthur E. Ratigan. Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery where Rev. Stanislaus E. Krolak of St. Bernard's Seminary gave the final blessing at the grave.
