

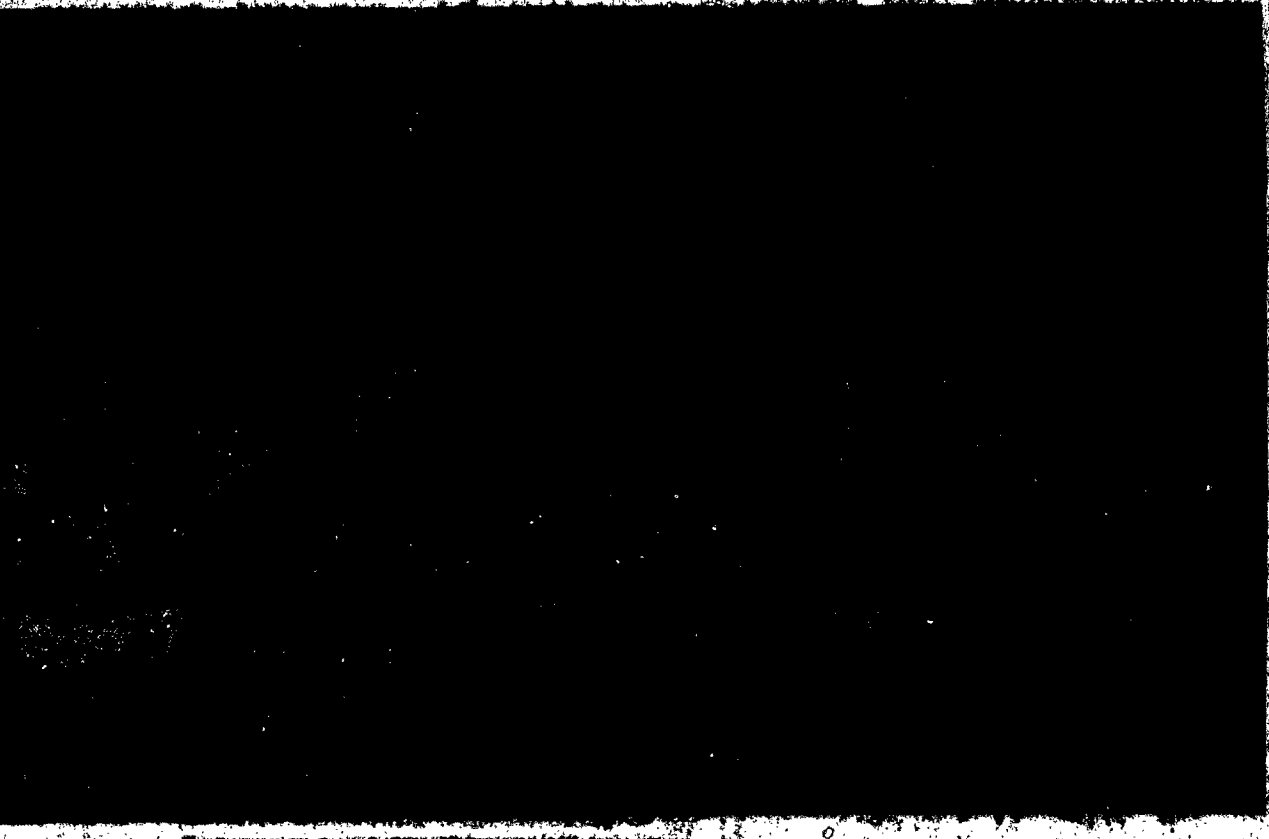
Arthur Miller Requiem Offered

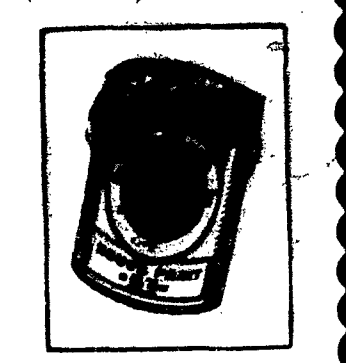
