

Vatican Fair Exhibit Nears 3 Million

New York — (NC) — More than 2.6 million persons visited the Vatican Pavilion in the first 40 days of the New York World's Fair.

Figures show that slightly more than 4 out of every 10 visitors to the fair have gone through the Vatican exhibit and viewed Michelangelo's classic sculpture, the Pieta.

In the week ending May 31, a total of 509,332 persons visited the pavilion including President Eamon deValera of Ireland.

The Vatican Pavilion has had an average of 65,535 visitors a day since being opened.

Apostolic Delegate

Vatican City — (NC) — An Italian papal diplomat who learned English at a high school in Africa has been named apostolic delegate to Canada.

Archbishop Sergio Pignedoli was named to the post (June 3) on the eve of his 54th birthday. Since 1960 he has been apostolic delegate to West Central Africa with headquarters in Lagos, Nigeria, where he attended English classes at St. George's high school to add that language to his knowledge of French, German, Spanish, Latin and his native Italian.

Before going to Africa, Archbishop Pignedoli had served for four years as auxiliary bishop to Pope Paul VI while the Pontiff was still Giovanni Cardinal Montini of Milan.

Priest's Job Making Jobs

Montpelier, Vt. — (NC) — A small town Catholic priest has been nominated for a \$1,000 award by Vermont Gov. Philip Hoff for valuable community service.

The Governor said Father George O. St. Onge of Richford "has proven that even the smallest, most remote community can help itself by capitalizing on its natural, human and other resources."

Father St. Onge is pastor of All Saints church in Richford, a community located near the tip of Vermont, on the Quebec border. In addition to caring for his 800 parishioners, he finds work for jobless men in the mill-town, which has a population of 2,300. If the 52-year-old priest can't find jobs, he makes them.

Finding there was a market for hockey sticks, Father St. Onge started a factory in an unused Richford building, has put six men to work and hopes to add 15 more as the project expands.

He has been engaged in economic development work for the past 10 years. Six years ago he was instrumental in establishing Jay Peak as a skiing area. Some 40 persons are now employed on what was once an unused snow-capped Vermont mountain.

He is still a director of the ski area corporation and is now taking a leading role in the development of the Cold Hollow ski area in Bakersfield.

Jews Defend Council Concern

New York — (NC) — The president of the American Jewish Committee, Morris B. Abram, has defended his organization against charges by Orthodox rabbis that it should stay out of Catholic theological discussions.

In particular, said Abram (June 24), the AJC feels it has a "primary objective" to persuade Christian bodies to change their teaching of Jews as being "Christ-killers." He said the committee was willing to work with officials of the Vatican council to achieve this end.

Two days earlier, officers of the (Orthodox) Rabbinical Council of America, meeting in Fallsburgh, N.Y., invited Jewish laymen for involving themselves in what were described as purely Christian concerns. Their criticism clearly pointed to officials of the American Jewish Committee, a human relations group, who have met with Augustin Cardinal Bea, head of the Vatican Secretariat for Christian Unity, and with Pope Paul VI concerning Christian-Jewish relations.

Abram said the AJC has not entered into areas of Christian theology, but has concerned itself rather with the need for good intergroup relations. He said AJC studies in the field of Christian-Jewish relations has had the support of Orthodox, Conservative and Reform rabbis.

At the same time, Abram denied that the AJC is a purely "secular" organization. He said Jews have never made distinctions between "clerical" and "lay" persons, but have regarded all Jews as members of the "kingdom of priests."

London Cathedral Center of Renewal

London — (NC) — Westminster cathedral's new administrator hopes to make that great downtown London church a center of liturgical renewal in England.

"The liturgy in Westminster cathedral will not be a ritual dance with the laity a mere spectator at a respectful distance," Magr. George A. Tomlinson said.

"It will be real worship, in which clergy and laity play real roles."

This fulfills the original conception of Westminster cathedral as a center where Englishmen of every persuasion could see the beauty of the Catholic liturgy in a splendid setting. Now the liturgy will not only be seen but shared.

Msgr. Tomlinson also plans to make the cathedral a center of theological study and ecumenical conversation. He said: "We contemplate a regularly scheduled series of theological lectures given by priests and laymen. The cathedral will become a focus of real theological knowledge and appreciation among the laity."

The stage was set for ecumenical dialogue at the cathedral this spring when Msgr. Tomlinson shared the leadership of an ecumenical pilgrimage to the Holy Land; Anglican Bishop Robert Stopford of London and the secretary of the British Council of Churches, the Rev. Kenneth Slack, were the other leaders. About 200 Anglicans, 100 Catholics and 80 other Protestants took part.


On Sunday evenings there was a united service with prayers, readings from the Old Testament, and a five-minute address by each of the three leaders.

"We also had a memorable visit with the Ecumenical Orthodox Patriarch Anthanasios in Istanbul," he said.
