'Family' First Communion

Music 'Communicates' Faith
 St. Louis — (RNS) — Liturgy is the most perfect form of communication and must always be open to change so that it can fulfill its function, an associate editor of "America" magazine said here in an address before the National Catholic Music Educators Association.

Father C. J. McNaspy, S.J., vice-president of the Catholic Arts Association and a member of the board of directors of the North American Liturgical Association, said music suggests many things, "but today, especially, music suggests liturgy. And liturgy gives rise to thought in the areas of symbol and communication."

He said the liturgy affects the most complete structure of music, affecting a sharing of "man with God. God with man, and man with man, and reminded musicians and teachers that they are "ministers of music."

Music is a "tremendous, continuing process," Father McNaspy said, "it makes individual feel part of a group."

He said reactions are generated by music which are not produced by other arts.

"I believe that what modern art is attempting to find is this mobility expressed by music," he told the convention. As examples, he cited the Civil Rights March in Washington last summer "where the most moving event was the singing of 'We Shall Overcome,'" and also a recent interview with Andre Girard, "who told me he was seeking, in his work with light, this mobility that is found in music."

The Second Vatican Council has opened some "remarkable" doors for Catholic musicians, according to Father McNaspy.

"It has given music more than a reluctant tolerance—it has given it a positive green light," he said, referring to the schema on the liturgy approved at the Council's last session.

"Remember that music not only adorns liturgy, but takes part in it," he told the music educators. "This puts it above the other arts."

Fr. Hesburgh Receives Medal
 Washington — (NC) — Father Theodore M. Hesburgh, C.S.C., president of the University of Notre Dame, was one of 50 persons whose names were announced by President Lyndon Johnson to receive the 1964 Medal of Freedom, the highest civil honor the President can bestow.

In making the announcement, President Johnson said: "Collectively, they have made man's world safe, his physical body more durable, his mind broader, his leisure more delightful, his standard of living higher and his dignity important."

At 47, Father Hesburgh is the second youngest of those to receive the medal. The date of the presentation was not announced.

Invitation To Council
 Vatican City — (RNS) — Pastor Mark Soegen, honorary president of the French Protestant Federation, has been invited to attend the third session of the Second Vatican Council as a guest observer.

Vatican Radio said the invitation was extended by the Vatican Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity, headed by Augustin Cardinal Bea.

Pastor Soegen, a longtime president of the World Council of Churches, was president of the French Protestant Federation for 31 years and head of the Reformed Church Council for 12.

The 55-year-old churchman was among the first Protestant leaders to call for prayers for the Ecumenical Council.
