Prison Chaplain Given Rutgers' Study Grant
Rev. James P. Collins, Catholic Chaplain at Elmira Reformatory was given a State Scholarship to the Rutgers University Summer School of Alcoholism Studies at New Brunswick, N.J.
Father Collins according to Don Bosco Bulletin, the inmates' own publication, left Monday, June 29 and will return Tuesday, July 21.
The school is reputed as the best in the country for the study of alcoholism. The inmates' paper said it should be of help to Father Collins in aiding inmates with a drinking problem.

3 Faiths Share Student Center
Cleveland — (RNS) — Plans were revealed here for a complex of buildings which would house all student religious centers.
Under one roof, but in separate buildings, will be the Student Christian Union (Protestant), the Ethel Foundation (Jewish) and the Newman Club (Roman Catholic). The complex, in University Circle, is close to Western Reserve University and Case Institute of Technology.
In citing Protestant contributions to Japanese Christian culture, he pointed to the promotion of Bible reading and the singing of hymns. He said that "Bible-reading nation in the world" and that much of the credit for this should go to Protestant scholars.

Task of Graduate Students Bring Church into World
Canton, Ohio — (NC) — A state university official recommended that Catholics "get out of the ghetto," advocated that Catholic college graduates attend state or nonsectarian graduate schools, and was critical of some Newman Club problems.
Speaking at the first annual convocation of Walsh College here, Charles G. Wilber, dean of Kent (Ohio) State University, advised the Catholic students: "You have had a thorough training in a Catholic institution. It is now up to you to do your part in bringing the Church into the world."
"There are not enough top level Catholics entering the state and nonsectarian graduate schools," Wilber said.
"You could do something for your faith there, and you might be able to do something for our Newman Clubs," the dean declared.
Wilber, a Catholic, praised the work of the Newman Club at Kent State University, but emphasized the club has only one priest to serve some 4,000 Catholic students.
The first person to be awarded a degree from Walsh College will be the man for whom the liberal arts institution is named: Bishop Emmet M. Walsh of

Colleges Need Newman Club
Columbia, (NC) — The University of Missouri president characterized the Newman Club program as a type which fits into the structure of American higher education without raising legal or constitutional questions about the teaching of religion.
President Elmer Ellis, speaking at the dedication of the Newman Center at the university here, advocated more such centers at other public universities and colleges.
"The center which we dedicate today is a most welcome addition to the facilities of this nature established by the Missouri churches to assist the university in one of the most vital aspects of its mission. We not only welcome these efforts, but we need the assistance they will render our educational program," Ellis said.
