### Hach Couple Leaves For Africa Mission Work

Mr. and Mrs. John Hach, former Rochesterians now residing in Buffalo, are leaving this week for Nyari, Kenya, East Africa to serve as Lay Mission-Helpers at St. Mary's Secondary School.

Mrs. Hach, the former Jean Marie Krapp, attended St. Ambrose School and Our Lady of Mercy High School. She is a teacher and will serve in this Catholic overseas mission in that capacity.

The Lay Mission-Helpers Association consists of Catholic lay men and women who volunteer to serve in overseas missions in their professional and occupational skills. These range from medical to educational, technical and administrative fields.

THE VOLUNTEERS agree to spend three years overseas under the supervision of the bishop of the diocese to which they are assigned. The only material compensation they receive is food, housing, medical care, and \$25 per month pocket money.

The Lay Mission-Helpers Association operates under the auspices of His Eminence James Francis Cardinal McIntyre, Archbishop of Los Angeles. Founder was a Los Angeles priest, Msgr. Anthony Brouwers. The Association has sent over 200 persons to missions overseas in Africa, and Latin America.

Each Lay Mission-Helper receives a year's training in theology, scripture, missiology and Catholic social doctrine. He also studies the language and customs of the area.

### Novena Set At Holy Family

The Annual Novena to Good St. Anne will begin at Holy Family Church on Sunday evening, July 19 and close on July 27 with the Papal Blessing.

This novena has been a tradition at Holy Family since 1884 when Father Dietrich Laurens, the new pastor, originated it.

Services for Father Baker Day, Wednesday, July 29, will begin with the offering of a Solemn Requiem Mass in Our Lady of Victory Basilica, Lackawanna, New York. The Most Rev. James A. McNulty, Bishop of the Diocese of Buffalo, will be the celebrant of the Memorial Mass for the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Nelson H. Baker.

Known as the "Padre of the Poor," Father Baker spent nearly 50 years directing and developing Our Lady of Victory Homes of Charity where countless dependent babies, boys, and unwed mothers have received tithes surround the Basilica and National Shrine he built and dedicated to his Patroness, Our Lady.

Since his death, July 29, 1936, the celebration of a Mass and the recitation of prayers at his grave occurred annually. The Very Rev. Msgr. Joseph M. McPherson, General Manager of the Homes, invites the public to participate in this year's Father Baker Day services.
