Churches in the rist area had only handfulls at Mass on Sun-day morning — many people too straig to venture into the streets.

About 25 nuns in four con while were quelly moved from the stee at a precautionary measure although no threats or violence were leveled at them.

Prayers were said in most churches Sunday morning for "peace and understanding" and many sermions used the Gospel theme of the Pharises and the sinner to make the point that no one person or group should consider themselves better than others.
