St. Bonaventure Tour Slated By Third Order

St. Patrick's Fraternity, Third Order of St. Francis, will conduct a public bus pilgrimage to St. Bonaventure University, Allegany on Sunday, Aug. 23, according to Rev. Nicholas J. Downs.

THE PILGRIMAGE, honoring the Aug. 25 Feastday of St. Louis of France, King and Patron of the Third Order of St. Francis, will leave St. Patrick's Church, as well as various points of the city, at 7:30 a.m. sharp.

A rest stop will be provided at Lechworth State Park where participants may obtain a sweeping view of Mt. Morris Dam.

The Rev. Charles Adams O.F.M., a native Rochesterian and instructor of Chemistry at St. Bonaventure University will welcome the group and celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at 11 a.m. in the recently constructed Friary.

At noon, a hot luncheon will be served in the dining hall. Franciscan priests and clerics will conduct groups the shrine dotted grounds and through the various buildings including the Friars' Memorial Library, an actual "treasure house" of priceless books and art.

The contents of the library many of which can readily be seen in the main reading room, including paintings by Rembrandt, figures unearthed in Greece and made some 2,500 years ago and a collection of ivories and

jade dating back through the centuries. A necklace worn by Queen Hatshepsut of Egypt, who ruled 1,800 years before Cleopatra, thus making this artistic ornament over 3,400 years old, is also included among the library's treasures.

The Rev. Ignaceus Hersher, O.F.M., head librarian since 1934, will present points of interest pertaining to books which date to the years long before Columbus discovered America.

The group will also tour Christ the King Seminary and the Friary, both designed by internationally known Bro. Cajetan Bauman, O.F.M., one of the foremost church architects in North America.

BROTHER CAJETAN, who entered the Franciscan brotherhood at Fulda, Germany in 1918 and at present heads the Office of Franciscan Art and Architecture in New York, describes his work as "progressive," and endeavors to reflect the gay and joyful spirit of St. Francis by permitting sunshine and light to enter every room and hallway of the buildings.

In the late afternoon the pilgrims will be welcomed at St. Elizabeth's Motherhouse of the Franciscan Sisters for a tour of the building, followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Return buses will arrive in Rochester at approximately 8:30 p.m.

Complete cost of the pilgrimage, including luncheon, will be \$7.00.
