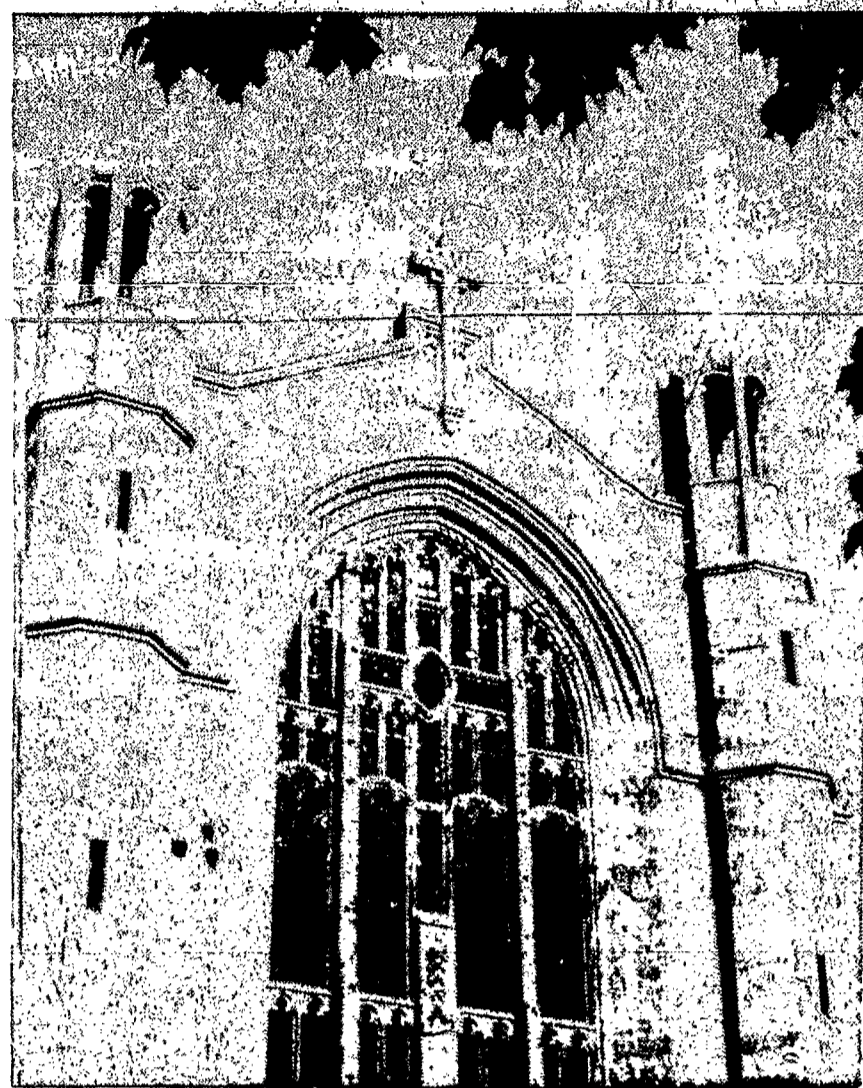


In Hoc Signo Vincas—In This Sign You Shall Have Victory

Here are some of the more than 150 churches in the Diocese with their crosses flung high and clear for all to see. Recognize them? Numbers are keyed to names listed below.



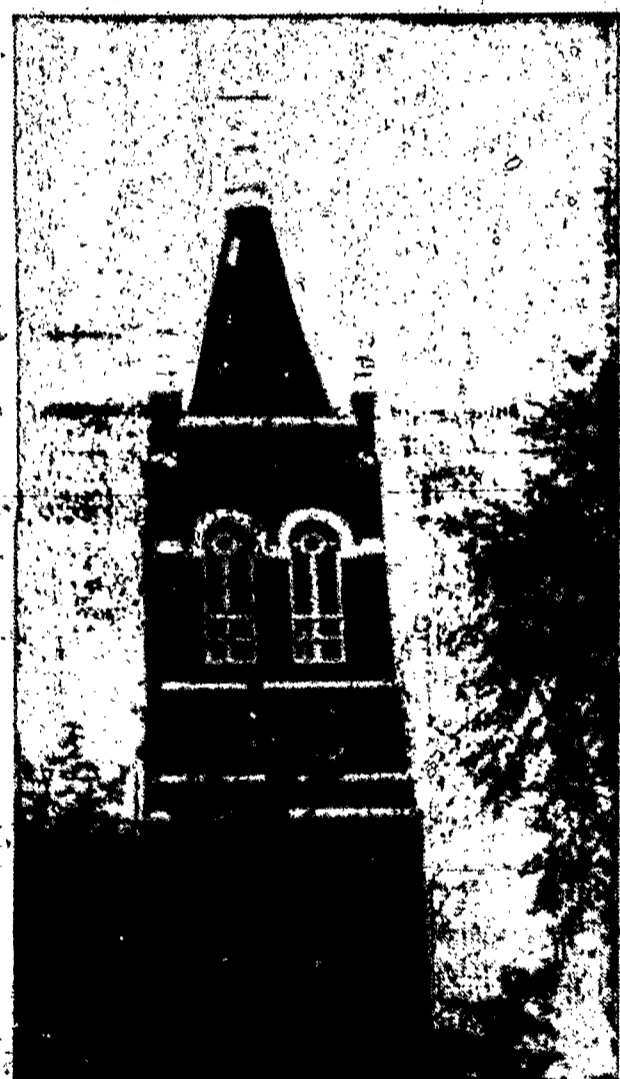
