Students Aid Retarded

Baltimore—(NC)—For more than 200 Catholic high school students in the Baltimore area, this summer is a time when they can teach their parents about the difficulties faced by retarded children.

The students, representing 10 different schools, are all volunteers at Rosewood State Hospital for children, just outside Baltimore. Their job, as they see it, is to help those who need help and to enlighten the adult population which is often reluctant to discuss the mentally handicapped.

"The students bring the community into the hospital and take the hospital back to the community," said Mrs. Irene M. Blackburn, director of volunteer services at Rosewood.

Since the student program started four years ago, Mrs. Blackburn said, the hospital is a "dark corner" no longer.

Carmelites to Aid Parishes in Liturgy Participation

Chicago—(RNS)—The Carmelite Third Order, auxiliary association of Catholic laymen and women, resolved at its 15th national conference here to assist in parish training programs involving forthcoming changes in the liturgy and increased lay participation in the Mass.

Liturgical changes, including expanded use of the vernacular (English), have already been approved by the Second Vatican Council. The role of the layman in the Church is still to be defined by the Council, but greater lay participation in the liturgy was emphasized at previous sessions.

"The pastors are going to need help in bringing about these changes, and we want our members to be a real help," said Father Alexis McCarthy, prior of Aylesford, the National Scapular Shrine Center at suburban Downers Grove.

Third Order delegates also adopted a resolution urging members to help implement the Civil Rights Act, both in letter and in spirit. Father McCarthy pointed out that this was an effort to bring about "justice for all people."

Clergy Deplore Vote Prejudice

Lake Charles, La.—(NC)—Catholic, Protestant and Jewish leaders have asked Louisiana citizens to disregard racial and religious considerations when voting.

A statement issued by the Calcasieu Parish (County) Ministerial Association deplored the fact that "religious factions and tensions" were evident in their community.

"Cherishing the American way of life, this group urges all citizens to vote their convictions, regardless of race or creed," the statement said. "Knowing that we are one under God, we seek to minimize our differences and exalt our common interests, so that continued harmony, brotherly love and good will may prevail in our community."

Greeks Against Rome Delegate

Athens—(RNS)—The Holy Synod of the Orthodox Church in Greece announced here that it had ruled against appointment of delegate-observers to the Second Vatican Council's third session.

Its announcement said that the invitation had been extended by the Vatican Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity, headed by Augustin Cardinal Bea.

There had been some speculation that the Greek Church would be represented by observers at the Council's third session beginning Sept. 14. Metropolitan Damaskinos of Volos in Thessaly, an influential member of the Holy Synod, told the press in June that he was "hoping" that observers would be appointed.
