

Bias Charged In School Aid Proposal

Philadelphia—(NC)—A resolution passed by the delegates to the Citizens for Educational Freedom convention has warned that amendments passed by Senate and House committees to the National Defense Education Act "amount to a general program of discriminatory federal aid by excluding private schools from the benefits."

The CEF is a non-denominational and non-partisan group which favors state aid to private and parochial schools.

The convention called upon "all friends of children in independent schools to protest strongly and immediately against the amendments which are still to be voted upon by the full House of Representatives."

The amendments would extend so-called "categorical grants" for studies in science, mathematics and foreign languages to nearly all the major subjects in the school curriculum, but would exclude independent schools.

While praising the removal of "discriminatory features" in the act regarding loan forgiveness and teacher training, the resolution said these good points "can hardly balance the threat of large scale general federal aid (initially \$80 million a year) for public schools only."
