

Saigon Rioters Attack School

Saigon—(NC)—Demonstrating antigovernment students in Hue this week broke into Providence Catholic School and stopped classes. A section of the crowd damaged the interior but reportedly desisted on remonstrations from a larger section of the demonstrating students. The police took no action.

During rioting at Da Nang demonstrators set fire to dwellings of Catholic fishermen. Fistfights were reported between Catholics and rioters.

FOUR PERSONS were reported to have been killed when grenades were thrown under circumstances still unclear.

At Qui Nhon Buddhist students reportedly stormed into a Catholic high school and tore up examination papers. Later a larger crowd, assertedly Buddhists, damaged the property of some Catholics in disorders lasting five hours. An unspecified number of people was injured.

Disorders in Saigon were not immediately marked by an anti-Catholic action. Reports that Catholic youths were responsible for burning the student center in Saigon seem speculative. The youths said they came from Govap, a suburb of Saigon, not as rumored from Catholic refugee villages. An onlooker did not notice any wearing crosses or medals. Leaflets scattered claiming they were Catholics could have been planted.

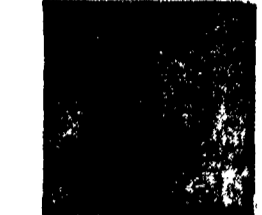

Hungarians Mark Feast

Budapest—(RNS)—Full ecclesiastical pomp and ceremony marked celebrations here commemorating St. Stephen, Hungary's first king, on the anniversary of the day in 1000 when his relics were solemnly enshrined here by order of Pope Gregory VII who had canonized him in the same year.

The universal feast of St. Stephen is on Sept. 2, but in Hungary his chief festival is on Aug. 20, when the Holy Dexter—the saint's mummified right hand—is taken from the crypts of St. Stephen's Basilica and exposed before the high altar for public veneration.

St. Stephen (970-1038) was crowned at Gran in 1001 with a crown presented by Pope Sylvester II. The 800th anniversary of his death was marked by a Eucharistic Congress opened in Budapest in May 1938 by Eugenio Cardinal Pacelli, the future Pope Pius XII.

Presbyterians Visit Pope Paul

Castel Gandolfo, Italy—(RNS)—Leaders of the United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. became the first top officials of a U.S. Protestant denomination to have a private audience with Pope Paul VI. Meeting with the Roman Catholic pontiff for 20 minutes at the papal summer residence at Castel Gandolfo were Dr. Edler G. Hawkins of New York, first Negro moderator of the 3.3 million member denomination, and Dr. Eugene Carson Blake, chief administrative officer.

San Francisco—(RNS)—The California referendum initiative which seeks to abolish the state's fair housing law and prevent the legislature from making future laws barring discrimination in realty transactions, Archbishop of Los Angeles.

Henry F. Organ, a Negro, was elected president of the San Mateo Chapter of the San Francisco organization in early August. He is reported to have said, before election, that his platform included a call for the removal of transfer of Cardinal McIntyre.

Organ was ousted as president by the parent agency because, in seeking action outside the San Francisco diocese, he had broken the Catholic Interracial Council's rules.
