Canadian Mass Rite Like U.S.

Ottawa — (NC) — The Canadian Catholic Conference announced an extensive plan for replacing Latin with the vernacular languages in the Mass and the administration of sacraments in Canadian Catholic churches.

Archbishop George B. Flahiff, C.S.B., of Winnipeg, chairman of the CCC board, said the plan for the changes, approved by the Canadian bishops at a meeting here on April 16, has now been confirmed by the Holy See.

TO ALLOW time for the preparation of the necessary texts and the working out of practical details for implementing the plan, the bishops of Canada have agreed it will go into effect January 1, 1965, according to an ordinance of the bishops to be issued later this fall.

This date was chosen to give bishops a chance to get home after the third session of the Vatican council, scheduled to close about Nov. 20, to lead in the final preparations for the changes in their respective dioceses. Meanwhile, altar missals and other necessary materials will be made ready.

The Canadian plan is similar to one decreed by the bishops of the United States, and expected to be in use by the end of this year. But whereas the Kyrie is to become English in the United States, it will remain in Greek in Canada. The Collect and Postcommunion will be in either English or French in Canada, but remain Latin in the United States.

Besides in the Mass, the plan provides for the use of English and French for baptisms, confirmations and weddings; for the bishop's allocation before each order of ordination; for the sacrament of the anointing of the sick, and for funerals, benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Forty Hours devotions; for the blessing of candles on Feb. 2, blessing and imposing of ashes on Ash Wednesday; and for much of the Holy Week liturgy, including the blessing of palms and the Palm Sunday procession, the blessing of the holy oils and the washing of feet on Holy Thursday, the liturgical service on Good Friday in honor of the Passion and Death of Our Lord, and the Paschal vigil service.

For the Masses of Holy Week, however, the norms for the Mass will apply. In the Mass, the vernacular is approved for "the people's parts."

At the beginning of Mass, the prayers at the foot of the altar remain in Latin. The priest will recite the Introit in the vernacular. The Kyrie Eleison will remain in Greek as a sign of unity with Catholics of the Eastern Rites.

The Gloria will be recited in the vernacular by the priest and people. Also in the vernacular will be the Collect, Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract and Sequence, and the Gospel. The Epistle and Gospel will be read facing the people. (Regarding the Epistle and Gospel, the new plan merely confirms a practice already in effect: reading the Epistle and Gospel in the vernacular facing the people.)

Encyclical Described as Encouraging

Geneva — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI's first encyclical was seen here by a World Council of Churches leader as "encouraging" for better inter-Church relationships but also as indicating that "we are yet far from the day of full unity."

Dr. W. A. Visser 't Hooft, WCC general secretary, in what he called "provisional" remarks made on receipt of the encyclical, found encouragement in the Pope's strong emphasis on the "necessity of dialogue" with non-Roman Catholic Christians.

At the same time, he said, the "concept of dialogue in the encyclical is not quite the same as we have used and practiced for many years in the ecumenical movement."

"According to the encyclical," Dr. Visser 't Hooft continued, "dialogue is mainly in the form of the communication of truth which the Roman Catholic Church holds."

"We understand dialogue, above all, as the process of sharing in which all receive and give and in which all are enriched and transformed."

Citing the encyclical's strong emphasis that papal primacy is the "key problem" in regard to Catholic relations with other Churches, the WCC executive commented that "for clarity and honesty of inter-Church discussion it is useful that this is stated so definitely."

"But this shows at the same time," he added, "that we are yet far from the day of full unity, for none of the non-Roman Churches accepts the view that recognition of the universal jurisdiction of the papacy is an indispensable criterion for church union."

The encyclical thus indicates, Dr. Visser 't Hooft concluded, "that what can be done at present is to establish better relationships between the Roman Catholic and other Churches rather than to make any considerable advance to union between the Roman Catholic and other Churches."

Malta Church Status Draws Criticisms

London — (RNS) — The duties and to manage her own affairs. Immediate criticism of the draft came from Labor Party groups in Malta, which are in opposition to Premier Borg Oliver's Nationalist government.

In one statement the Labor Party said: "The British Conservative government has negotiated a new so-called independence constitution, a defense treaty, and a financial agreement solely with Maltese ministers who were unfairly elected to office through the infliction of spiritual injuries (upon opposing candidates) by local representatives of the Roman Catholic Church."

In Britain, criticism came in another form from Michael de la Bédoyère, former editor of the Catholic Herald who now produces a privately-circulated Catholic newsletter.
