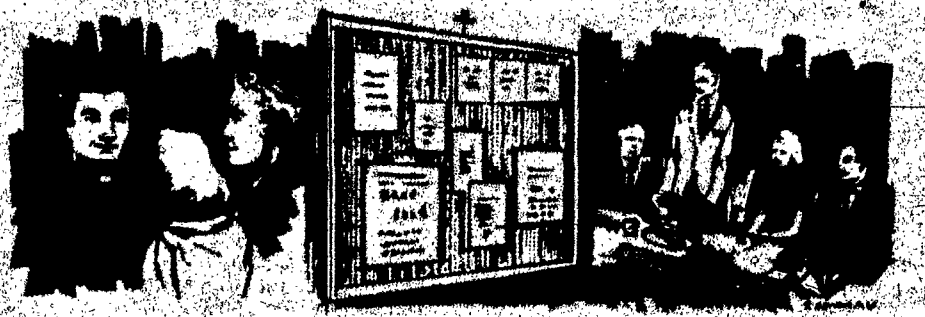

While the practice of several concelebrants participating in the one Mass is common in Eastern Rite Catholic churches, it is very rare in the Latin Rite churches.

Provision for greater use of concelebration is provided in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, passed last year by the Second Vatican Council and promulgated by Pope Paul.
