

Nun, Two Priests Added To Fisher College Faculty

A Sister of Mercy and two priests are among the new faculty appointments announced for the 1964-65 academic year at St. John Fisher College.

SISTER MARY PETER, R.S.M., who has been head of the Reading Laboratory at the Catholic University of America, will teach psychology at Fisher on a part-time basis. She received her doctorate in psychology from the University of Rochester, has her master's degree from Fordham University, and received her undergraduate degree from St. Mary's College, Notre Dame, Indiana.

REV. EUGENE C. BAMEL, C.S.B., who joins the Philosophy Department at St. John Fisher, is a former instructor at Aquinas Institute. He returns to Rochester from St. Brant Seminary, Toronto. Father Bamel also taught at St. Michael's College of the University of Toronto and holds a master's degree in philosophy from the University.

REV. ROBERT G. RITZ, C.S.B., will be the newest member of the Department of Mod-

ern Languages on the hilltop campus. Father Ritz earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Toronto and has completed additional graduate work at Laval University, Quebec, and the University of Lyons, France. He has been teaching modern languages for 12 years.

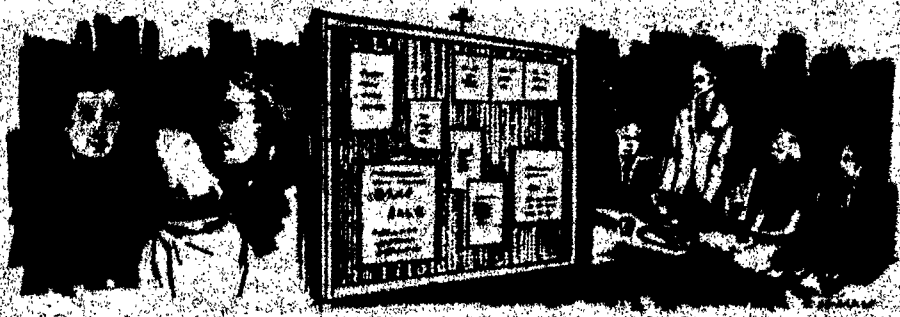

Bishop, 5 Priests Offer Same Mass

St. Pierre, Man. (RNS)—The rare occurrence of a Latin Rite Catholic bishop concelebrating Mass with five priests was seen here when Archbishop Maurice Baudoux of St. Boniface marked the 35th anniversary of his ordination.

The priests, each marking his 25th anniversary, were Oblate Fathers Wilfred Sicotte, Omer Robidoux, Jean Lambert, Hilaire Gagne and Thomas Paradis.

The archbishop had the personal permission of Pope Paul VI for the second concelebration in which he has shared. While the practice of several concelebrants, participating in the one Mass is common in Eastern Rite Catholic churches, it is very rare in the Latin Rite churches.

Provision for greater use of concelebration is provided in the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, passed last year by the Second Vatican Council and promulgated by Pope Paul.

During the Mass, the six priests faced the congregation, prayed together and shared one large consecrated host.
