KC Head Asks End To Membership Bias

New Orleans—(NC)—Some "when we can no longer close our eyes to the fact that the Knights of Columbus is an outmoded admission society which permits a definite minority to sit in such a way that these criticisms are justified."

Ten state councils have proposed to the national body that the membership regulations be modified. Under existing procedures, an applicant can be refused membership in a local council if the majority votes are cast against him. These procedures have been seen by many as being discriminatory against Negroes.

In his statement, McDevitt said that the national body should amend its rules governing the process of membership selection and thereby remove forever the opportunities of prejudice that tend to dilute our status.

Parish of Silence

New Orleans—(NC)—Rev. priest Father Springer said, "This is a source of embarrassment in which a problem of communication must be bridged."

There is no response from the priest except the written answer. Naturally, they prefer a priest who can talk their own language.

The 38-year-old native of New Orleans was ordained in 1952 and served for a while in a parish in Oklahoma.

In 1954 he was transferred to Baton Rouge where for eight years he was part-time chaplain of the Louisiana School for the Deaf. He is in his third year as "pastor" of the deaf people in the archdiocese of New Orleans.

Masses and other services geared to the world of the deaf and hard of hearing are held in temporary quarters at Our Mother of Perpetual Help chapel in the mid-New Orleans area.

Seminary Rectors Plan New Liturgy Courses

St. Louis—(NC)—A specially called national institute for seminary rector and professors in development of liturgical courses for the priesthood will be held here from Aug. 23 through 31.

A committee appointed by Archbishop John F. Dearden, chairman of the American Bishops' Liturgical Commission, planned the institute to follow immediately after the close of the national Liturgical Week here.

The institute was hurriedly called in order to give seminary faculties some training in liturgy courses before the beginning of the next school year.

The sessions will plan to comply with the requirement of the Constitution on the Liturgy, which states that "the study of sacred liturgy is to be carried among the clergy and major courses in seminaries and religious houses of studies; in theological faculties it is to rank among the principal courses."

Planning the institute are Father Gerard Sloyan, president of the National Liturgical Conference; Father Bernard Cooke, S.J., chairman of the theological faculty at Marquette University; and Father Aelred Tegels, O.S.B., professor of liturgy at St. John's Abbey, Collegeville, Minn.

Mission Bible Schools

Miss, Mich.—(NC)—The Congregation of Christian Doctrine here is sponsoring three "Home Mission Bible Schools" this summer, first of their kind ever offered in the Lansing diocese.

The first school at Sacred Heart parish attracted over 300 children in grades one to six to a three-week course. Ninety per cent of them were non-Catholic Negroes. The rest were Catholic children attending both Catholic and public schools.

'Mixed Feelings' On Encyclical

New York—(RNS)—Archbishop Iakovos, Primate of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of North and South America, expressed "mixed feelings" over the first encyclical of Pope Paul VI and questioned the document's effect on Christian unity efforts.

The encyclical, the archbishop said in a statement issued here, is "marked by a naive attempt . . . to reconcile the courageous ecumenism of John XXIII with the traditional Roman Catholic ecumenism . . ."

Also, he said, it introduces "a new concept of dialogue or relationship with all Christian and non-Christian peoples, linked with a very peculiar solution of syncretism."

The Greek Orthodox churchman, who was present in the Holy Land when Pope Paul made his historic pilgrimage and met with Ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras of Istanbul, supreme leader of Eastern Orthodoxy, said the encyclical emphasizes an ecumenical goal short of Christian unity.

"Pope Paul's ecumenism," he said, "introduces the term 'unification' as a substitute for unity or union, for he seems to have come to the conclusion that unification or cooperating with other Christian Churches as non-Christian religions is the sole practical target at which unity-inspired Christian endeavor should aim at present."
