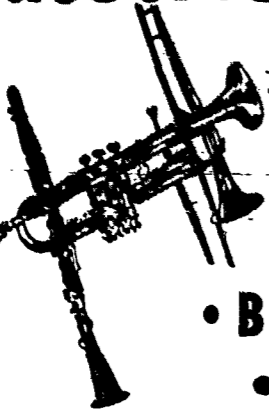

Harry McCarrick Requiem Offered Ancient Temples Found On Samaritan Mountain

Funeral Mass for Harry J. McCarrick was offered by Rev. Donald J. Murphy in St. Pius X Church, Aug. 29. Mr. McCarrick, 58, of 21 Hallock Rd., World War 2 Veteran and employee of American Laundry Machinery Division of McGraw Edison Co. died August 26, 1964.

He was a member of the Nocturnal Adoration Society and of St. Pius X Holy Name Society. Mr. McCarrick served in the Army in Europe from Normandy through Germany and was discharged in November, 1945.

Surviving are his wife, Helen Esterheld McCarrick; one son, Henry T. McCarrick; three daughters, Ann M., Margaret M. and Eileen T.; four brothers, Connor, Patrick and Stanley of England and Eugene McCarrick of Ireland; four sisters, Elganoy, Long Island and Clare, Toronto, Canada; several nieces and nephews.

Amman, Jordan (RNS)—Further excavations by the American archeological expedition which unearthed the Old Testament city of Shechem some 31 miles north of Jerusalem have led to the discovery there of two temples on Mount Gerizim, holy mountain of the Samaritans.

Two miles from the ancient Roman town of Nablus, and now known as Tell-Balah, Shechem was, for a time, the chief city of the Samaritans, who still have a small colony in Nablus.

The archeological team, led by Professor Ernest Wright of Harvard University, began its work in 1956. The discovery was announced by Dr. Awad al-Djani, director of the Jordanian Department of Antiquities, who said one of the temples dated back to the time of the Roman Emperor Hadrian, who ruled from 117 to 138 A.D. He said the second temple was built on the same site with material taken from the older building.

According to Dr. Djani, Hadrian built the first temple over other buildings to honor Zeus, a pagan deity, and used the bronze gates from the Jerusalem Temple destroyed by the Romans in 70 A.D.
