For the second time in a period of eleven days, Rev. Albert Gaelens, C.S.B., vice-principal of Aquinas Institute, celebrated a solemn funeral Mass for one of his parishioners. The late Mrs. Marie Gaelens, mother of Father Gaelens and of Sister Mary Hilaire, R.S.M., of Notre Dame High School, Elmira, died suddenly August 30, at the age of 88. She was the widow of the late Gaston Gaelens who died August 19, and whose solemn funeral Mass was offered August 22 by his priest-son.

Mrs. Gaelens' solemn funeral Mass was celebrated at Our Lady of Victory Church on Wednesday, Sept. 2, at 9:30 a.m. Father Gaelens was assisted by Rev. Scholarship Program Opened by State K.C.

Start of the New York State Council, Knights of Columbus sponsored Scholarship Program for 1964 is announced today by State Deputy Herman Wolkenberg, John J. Wayte, 47 Sussex St., Port Jervis, N.Y. 12771 is appointed chairman.

The state is divided into 12 districts with three scholarships in each district for a total of 37 awards. A special offer is that of the "Joseph S. Coffey Jr." Memorial Scholarship which is on a statewide basis, in the sum of \$200 a year for a four-year period.

Also to be awarded is the Joseph F. Lamb Memorial Award Scholarships in the amount of \$400.00 a year for each of four years, one scholarship for each district.

Scholarships are open to any Catholic graduate of a recognized high school in New York State during the term ending January or June 1965. Candidates are required to submit to a preliminary regular college entrance test in scholastic aptitude given by the College Entrance Board of Princeton, N.J., on Saturday, Dec. 5, 1964.
