## Central Union Meets in Rochester

More than 200 delegates of the Catholic Central Union of America, the National Catholic Women's Union and Catholic Central Youth Union attended their annual state convention in Rochester on the Labor Day weekend.

## Monsignor Widman Rites Native Of Canandaigua

The Rt. Rev. Mgr. Edward G. Widman, pastor emeritus of Sacred Heart Church, Buffalo, died Sunday, August 30, 1964, in Sacred Heart Home of the Brothers of Mercy in Clarence, after a six-week illness.

At 62 years of age, Monsignor Widman retired in 1953, but continued to live at the church rectory and to celebrate Mass daily until his recent illness.

He was pastor of Sacred Heart Church for 20 years and former pastor of St. Charles, now Queen of All Saints, Lackawanna, and of St. Patrick's, Limestone. Other previous assignments included assistant pastor at Holy Family, St. Mary Magdalene and St. Agnes churches in Buffalo; St. John Olean and administrator of St. Mary's, Hooley.

Monsignor Widman was born in Canandaigua and attended Catholic schools there. He began studies at St. Mary's College, North East, Pa., a preparatory seminary for Redemptorist fathers. He studied theology and philosophy at St. Bernard's Seminary here, and was ordained by Bishop Bernard J. Mahony on June 14, 1902, at St. Patrick's Cathedral. He celebrated his first solemn High Mass at St. Mary's in Canandaigua.

He is survived by 17 nieces and nephews, 8 of whom reside in Rochester. Mrs. Gertrude Sweetland, Mrs. Louise Golden and Mrs. E. Murphy, several grandnieces and grandnephews, including the Rev. John Widman, Navy Chaplain in Norfolk, Va.

A Pontifical Solemn High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by Bishop James A. McNeally, Bishop of Buffalo, Wednesday, Sept. 2.

Burial was at United German and French R. C. Cemetery in Buffalo, N.Y.

## McQuaid High Sponsors Pilgrimage To Auriesville

McQuaid Jesuit High School is sponsoring a bus and car pilgrimage to Auriesville, the National Shrine of the North American Martyrs, on Sunday, Sept. 27. Rochester pilgrims will join others from all over the state of New York and neighboring states to honor the Martyrs on their feast day.
