Help Wanted in Missions

Chicago—(NC)—A South Dakota priest has 1,000 Indians in his parish—but no curate and no nuns to help him care for them.

An Oregon pastor wants to vitalize the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine program in his parish. It covers an area that includes four high schools and 12 grade schools—none of them Catholic.

The superintendent of schools in a Texas diocese calls the lay teacher situation there "pathetic." Church schools cannot afford qualified teachers because one-quarter of the area's Catholic families earn less than \$3,000 yearly.

New Anglican 'Ambassador' Set For Rome

London—(NC)—Archbishop Michael Ramsey of Canterbury, Anglican Primate, has appointed an associate secretary to the Church of England Council on Foreign Relations who will also serve as his "ambassador" or personal liaison in Rome.

He is the Rev. John Findlow, who has been serving as chaplain of British embassies throughout Europe. Presently stationed at the British embassy in Athens, he will take up his new appointment in January.

Dr. Findlow succeeds Canon Bernard Pawley, Archbishop Ramsey's present liaison in Rome, who will remain there during the third session of the Vatican council, with the official Anglican observers. The new post will be concerned with Archbishop Ramsey's recently appointed commission on Roman Catholic relations in this country. In addition to keeping in touch with the Vatican secretary's liaison work, Dr. Findlow will continue to serve on the foreign relations council and Catholic relations commission.

Archbishop Ramsey has also named five observers, including an American and a Canadian, for places allotted the Anglican Communion in the third session of the Vatican council.

Aquinas To Open With Corning

With the opening game of the 1964 football season against Corning East High School scheduled Friday night, Sept. 18, coach Joe Repko is well satisfied with the work of his Little Irish eleven on offense and defense.

"We are going to have a good club this year," Repko predicts. "We hope to give Aquinas the best football team in the area—playing a brand of football that people like to come out and watch," he added.

Slight letterman constitute the nucleus of the club which shapes up as a fairly light, but speedy outfit.

An eight game schedule including six at home and two away will be played by the Little Irish. Featured are games with McQuaid Jesuit High School of Rochester and St. Joseph-High School of Cleveland, an Ohio powerhouse undefeated in eighteen games. The meeting with McQuaid, set for October 11, is the first ever in the varsity level between the two local schools.

Aquinas should enjoy good quarterbacking this season. Leading candidates for the guard and center jobs are left tackle John Blinco and center Craig Singler. Both better than average passers.

Anchoring the offensive line are veteran Dick Schaeffl and Billie Jim Ryan at left tackle and Tom Hurlberg, Bob Burgess and Eugene weighing in over 300 and have plenty of game experience.

Repko should find more of these help in halfback Pat DiNocis, who was impressive for Hunk Vada's junior varsity last year. Halfback Gary Mulligan may provide a breakaway threat.

Tom Guerinet is also battling for a halfback position.

Senior Bob Wengender and junior George Kermis are leading candidates for the guard job. Dick Winterroth will probably lead the starting center job backed up by Mike Bloane.

Repko is especially happy about the work of first-year center Dick Winterroth who played last season but has been shifted to fullback. Dick is president of the Aquinas student body and a letterman on the Irish track team.

Another veteran, Pete Meyer, may see double duty as a tackle and linebacker.

A place-kicker is one of the main season concerns of the Irish coaching staff. Greg Manley looks to be the most promising to date.

All home games will be played at Aquinas Memorial Stadium, Ridgeway Avenue. Tickets for all games and season passes are available from all Aquinas students.
