CDA Schedules Fashion Show

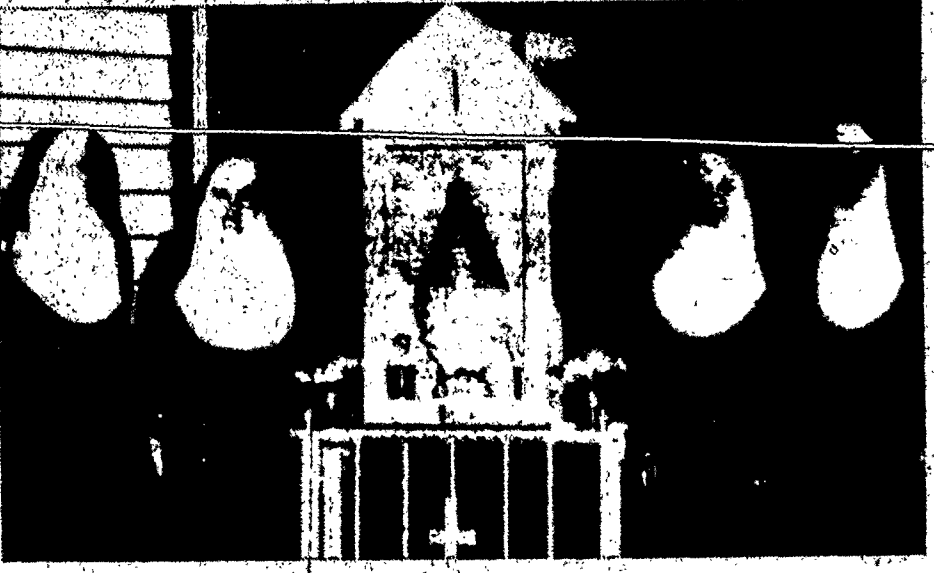
