

**Book Reviews

Civic Center**

Louis Auchincloss' best-selling novel, "THE RECTOR OF JUSTIN," will be reviewed by the Rev. Robert Miller in the opening session of the Noonday Book Review series, next Tuesday, Sept. 23 at 12:30 p.m. The half-hour critique will take place in the Catholic Evidence Library, on the main floor of the Columbus Civic Center, 55 Chestnut Street.

Now in its fourth year, the Noonday Book Review offers a varied diet in its fall schedule this year. The books to be analyzed cover the areas of liturgy, race, the Vatican Council and Catholic education.

Series opener Father Miller is associate editor of the CATHOLIC COURIER-JOURNAL. Ordained eight years, he served as assistant pastor in Good Shepherd parish, Henrietta, and St. Margaret Mary's, Irondequoit, before entering the journalistic world. The work he will review is the story of the rector of a famous New England boys school.

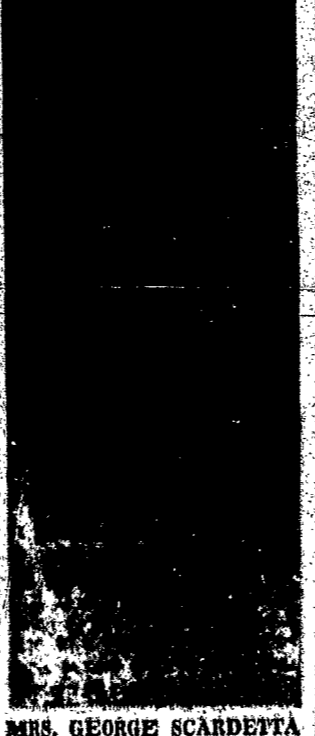

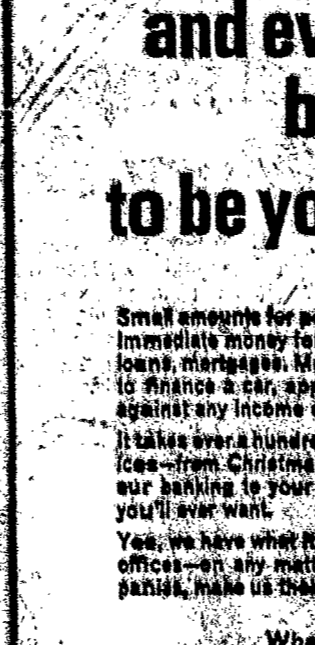
The Rev. Harold F. Prendergast, uncle of the groom, performed the double ring ceremony and celebrated the nuptial Mass.

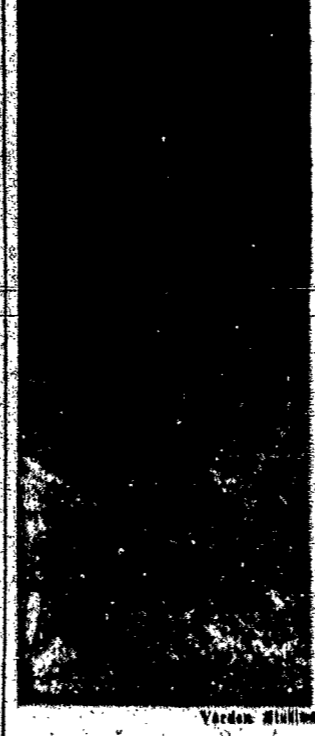
Mrs. Joseph Salerno, sister of the bride, played nuptial Mass. Accompanied Miss Mary Lynn Metternich and Laisha Hurley.

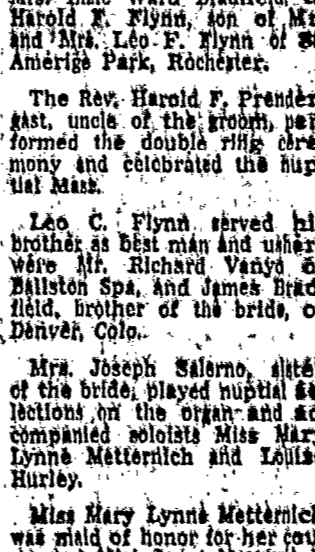

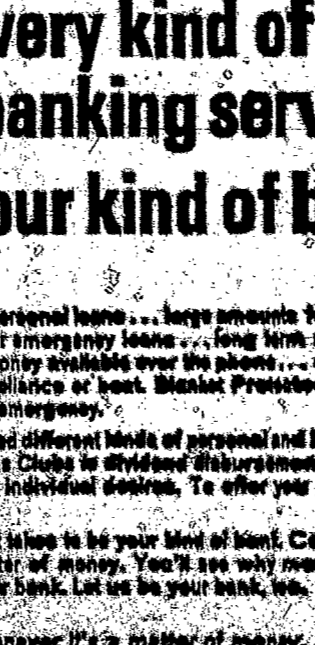

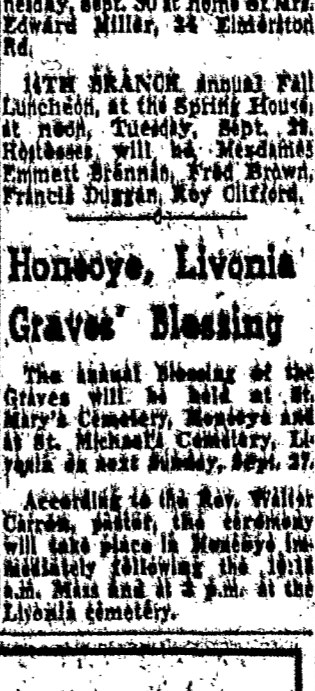
