Notre Dame Crusaders, fresh from their first victory of the season over Southside High School's Green Hornets, will attempt to lengthen their winning streak on Friday, Sept. 25, when they play Hornell High School at Notre Dame's stadium.

Hornell lost its opening game of the year's season to Bradford, by a score of 39-6, and were defeated by the Crusaders last year in a 19-7 victory.

COACH NICK TETA, greatly pleased with his boys' showing against Southside, will rely on much the same crew when the Crusaders play their first home game on Friday.

Southside was the holder of a perfect 8-0 record against intracity competition until the Crusaders snapped the string in last Saturday's 26-7 thrill at Parker Field. It was the first time for a Notre Dame victory over the Green Hornets in five seasons.

On the first play from scrimmage, Mike Bennett, Notre Dame quarterback, threw a 45-yard bomb to halfback Joe Cas-

Hamilton was the team's leading ground-gainer with 83 yards in 30 carries. Don Malone, a junior making his first start at end for the Crusaders, caught two touchdown strikes from Mike Bennett, one coming on a 48-yard throw.

Bennett, handling the team perfectly, was 8 for 11 passing, and those eight completions resulted in 195 yards and three touchdowns.

NOTRE DAME defense, led by two-year all-city tackle Mike Malone, stopped the Hornets cold until S.H.S. fullback Al Pierce broke away for a 8-yard touchdown.

Malone, tackle Bernie Minch, and linebacker Joel Ramech should cause trouble for ND's opponents this year, as the Crusaders try for a winning season. Seven consecutive wins last year, plus Saturday's opening game, give them an 8-game streak for a promising future in Elmira's football picture.
