## Record Enrollment Seen For 5.6 Million

Washington — (NC) — Catholic elementary and secondary schools have enrolled about 5,658,000 students this month, according to a preliminary estimate made here. High schools, in contrast to the situation of only a few years ago, clearly are emerging as place-setters in percentage of enrollment increase, according to an estimate released by the Department of Education of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

Grade school enrollment, which has run as high as three or four per cent in some past school years, continues a de-

celeration first noted sharply three years ago.

Elementary school enrollment this year should be about 4,600,000 in contrast to 4,549,000 last year and high schools should enroll about 1,083,000 in contrast to about 1,041,307 last year.
