Record Enrollment Seen For 5.6 Million

Omaha, Neb. — (NC) — Gen. Thomas S. Power, USAF, chief of the Strategic Air Command, was honored here with membership in the Order of St. Sylvester.

Washington — (NC) — Catholic elementary and secondary schools have enrolled about 5,658,000 students this month, according to a preliminary estimate made here. High schools, in contrast to the situation of only a few years ago, clearly are emerging as place-setters in percentage of enrollment increase, according to an estimate released by the Department of Education of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

Grade school expansion, which has run as high as three or four per cent in some past school years, continues a de-

celeration first noted sharply three years ago.

MAJOR FACTORS in the slow-down in growth of elementary school numbers appear to be grade-dropping, which will take away 10,000 pupils in Cincinnati this year, a continued shortage of teaching Sitters because they are being held back until they finish all college courses, new regulations in several dioceses cutting down

average class size and the financial strain being parished from recent costly school expansions and hiring of lay teachers.

Nevertheless, the estimated 1964 fall enrollments indicate another high mark in an unbroken series of enrollment records over the past two decades.
