**Notre Dame Sisters Name Sister Aloise**

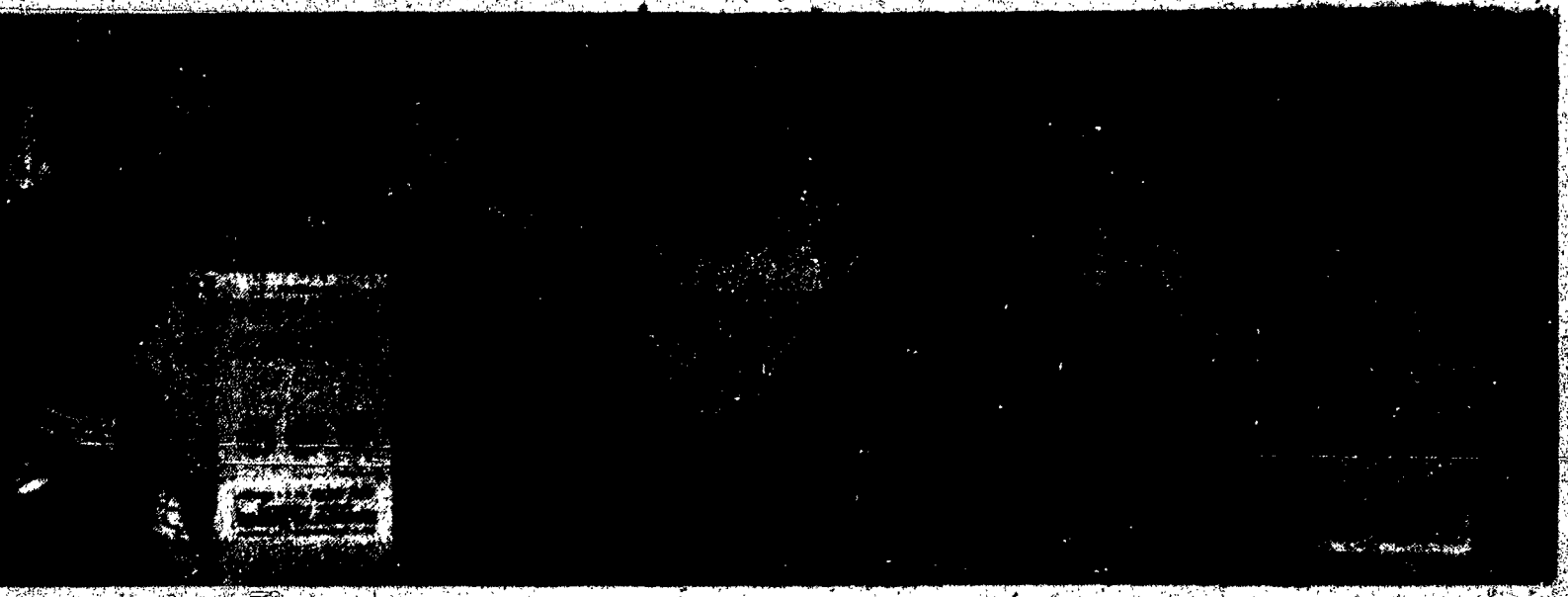
The School Sisters of Notre Dame have appointed Community Supervisor Sister Mary Aloise, principal of Holy Family School.

**Nazareth College Lists Georgetown Scholar**

"A New Look for Religious Fiction" will be discussed at Nazareth College Thursday, October 8, by a Georgetown University author, teacher and critic who has gained national prominence for his work in the field.

Wiley Hughes, associate professor of English at Georgetown, will deliver the 8 p. m. lecture. He will explore the impact of the second Vatican Council on fiction, with particular reference to Flannery O'Connor's fictional approach. Hughes will also direct special class discussions in the areas of creative writing and fiction criticism at Nazareth during the period October 7-9.

Currently director of the Georgetown University Writers Conference, Hughes is also an associate director of the 175th anniversary programs of the university and literary critic of Columbia magazine.

**Fisher Gets Kodak Grant**

St. John Fisher College is among 62 privately supported colleges and universities which received a direct grant from the Eastman Kodak Company. It was announced by Wiley Fitzgerald Charles J. Lavery, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher.

The grant, amounting to \$11,400, is based upon the number of graduates of the college who have completed five years of employment with Kodak.

In receiving the grant, Father Lavery paid tribute to Kodak for its program of aid to higher education which is based on the recognition that the social cost of education is considerably greater than the tuition and fees paid by students.

St. John Fisher College graduated its first class in 1835. Seventy-five per cent of its 765 graduates live in the Rochester community.

**Fisher Prof Adds New Post**

Robert J. McLaughlin, assistant professor of philosophy at St. John Fisher College, has been named as the new official representative of the college to the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation.

The foundation, named for the 28th President of the United States, provides one-year graduate fellowships to members of the teaching profession.

Mr. McLaughlin, a member of the Fisher faculty for the past six years, expects to receive his doctorate in philosophy from the University of Toronto in the near future.
