### Cornerstone Rites In Savannah

Savannah—The cornerstone was laid for the new St. Patrick's Church in Savannah on Sunday afternoon, Sept. 13. On hand for the ceremony were priests of the parish, visiting clergymen, parish trustees and auditors, members of the building board, and parishioners. A small frame church on the eastern outskirts of the village has served the Parish for almost ninety years and is no longer large enough or suitably located.

THE PASTOR of Clyde and Savannah, the Rev. Paul J. Cuddy, acted as master of ceremonies. Father Cuddy introduced the Rev. Joseph T. Gynor, assistant pastor, who spoke briefly, as did Father William Doran of St. Anne's, Palmyra, and Father Henry Adamski of St. Stanislaus, Rochester. Father Doran blessed the cornerstone and sealed into it various memorabilia for the information of generations yet to come.

Visiting priests included Father Francis Turner, pastor of Clifton Springs; Father John Guy, pastor of Montezuma, and Father Eugene McFarland of the Catholic Youth Office in Rochester.

The new church is located on Grand Avenue in the village, near the public school. The basement of the church will contain classrooms where children attending the public school will receive religious instructions. Also in the basement will be a modern kitchen and meeting room for the societies of the parish.

The church itself is a one-story concrete edifice with stucco facing, colored glass windows and laminated woodwork. During the financial drive conducted in October of 1963, some thirty families pledged \$30,000 for the construction of the new church.

The Kings defeated Waterloo, the Finger Lakes champions, 18-6, but lost to Watertown, 9-0 and will be out to break the Elmira's winning record.

The players Notre Dame will be watching closely are Rick Coleman and Phil Smith. Coleman, a scabbard, had a spectacular 88-yard touchdown gallop against Waterloo. Smith, the quarterback, exhibited great poise and threw one touchdown pass in the Waterloo game. The Kings are noted for playing hard and determined football.

The Crusaders will go to Rochester exhibiting an offense capable of exploding for the long bomb or crunching out the yards by power plays up the middle or end sweeps.

Against Hornell, Larry Hamilton scored one touchdown and gained 113 yards in 13 carries. Joe Casio scored two touchdowns and rushed for 67 yards. Mike Bennett worked the draw play very effectively to Joel Ramich in crucial situations and picked up key first downs.

ND's defense took advantage of three fumbles and an intercepted pass to keep Hornell away from the goal line. Tim Backes, Mike Malone and Ben D'Aloisio were defensive standouts for the Crusader.
