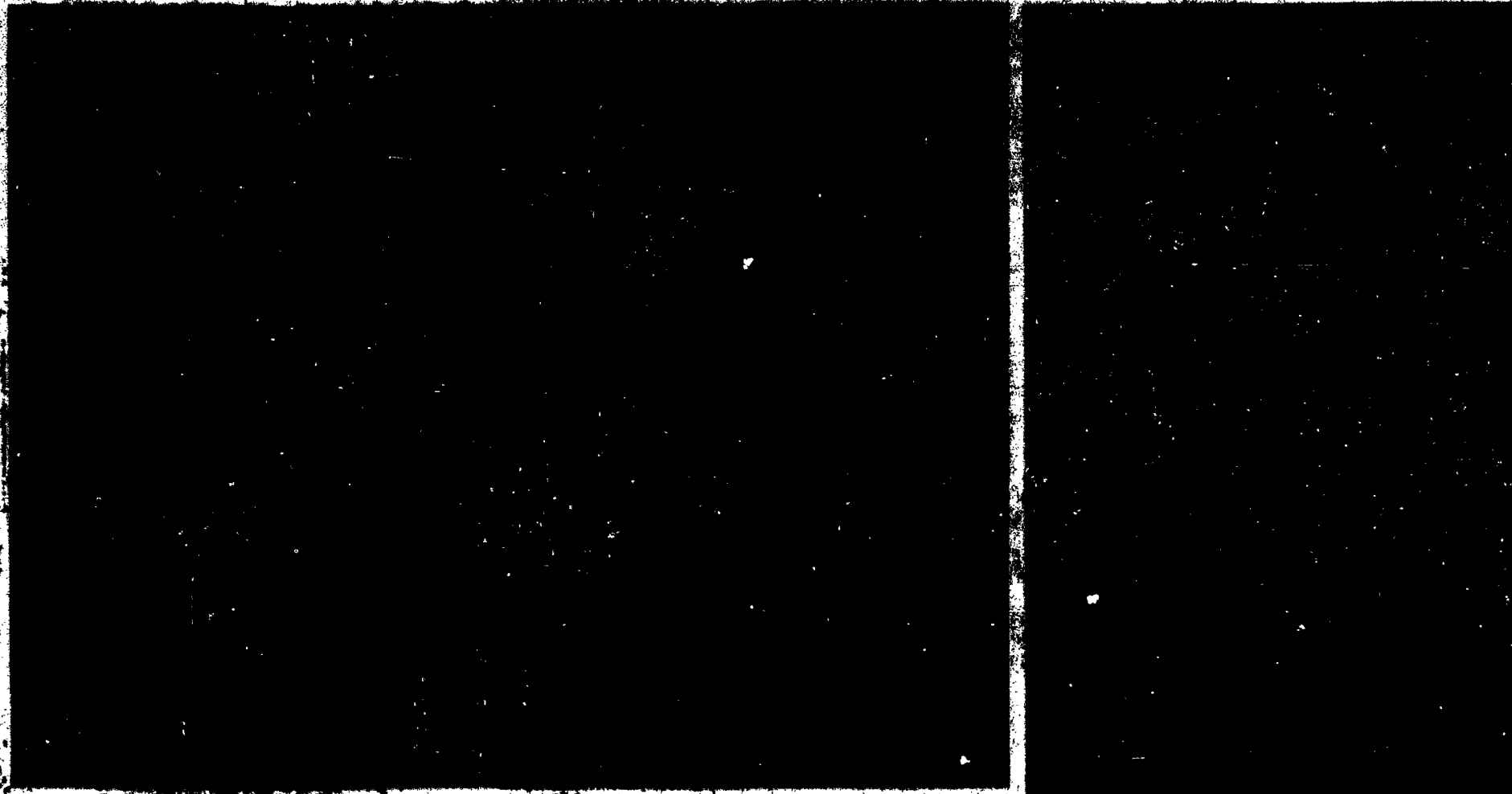


Seventh Ward Religious Art Exhibit

Father Francis Vogt invites neighbors and former parishioners to an open house at newly redecorated St. Bridget's school this Sunday, Oct. 11, 4 to 8 p.m. The school's second floor, long unused, has been restored to double the school's capacity. St. Bridget's, on Hamlet St., is in the heart of the "inner city" — an area widely considered a "problem" section of Rochester. Father Vogt says the redecoration project is "our vote of confidence in our neighbors."

Music was also provided by a children's choir called the King David Choral Group.

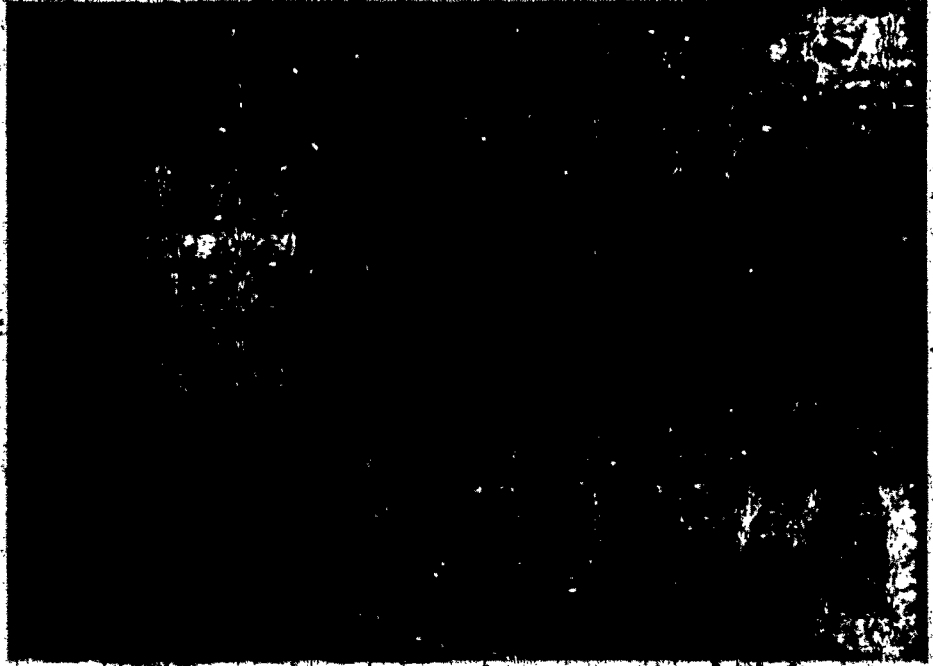
The exhibit was the climax of a series of religious art exhibits in the seventh ward.

Behind the program is Mrs. Bernice M. Dolan who has organized a team of volunteer artists to staff her art center — which also has hours at 145 Hamlet St.

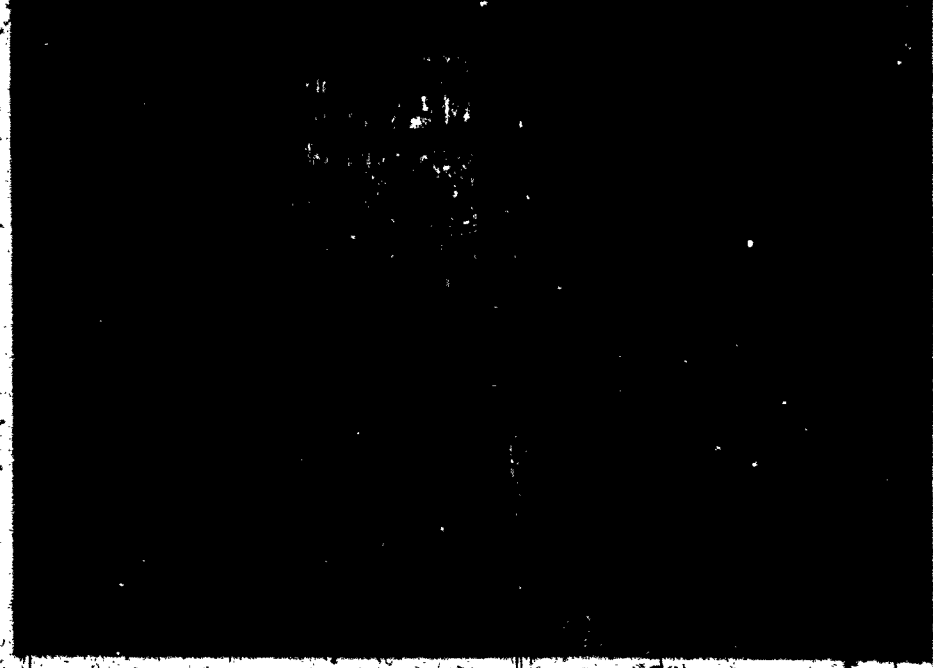
"We have 40 children in the school and they're only a fraction of all we'd like to reach," Dolan said.

She said visitors are welcome to see the art center in operation any day after school or all day Saturdays. She also said parish groups desiring to hear about the work and help of the center may contact her and a speaker will attend a meeting of these groups.

What does the center need? "Everything — money, people, materials," replied Dolan.
