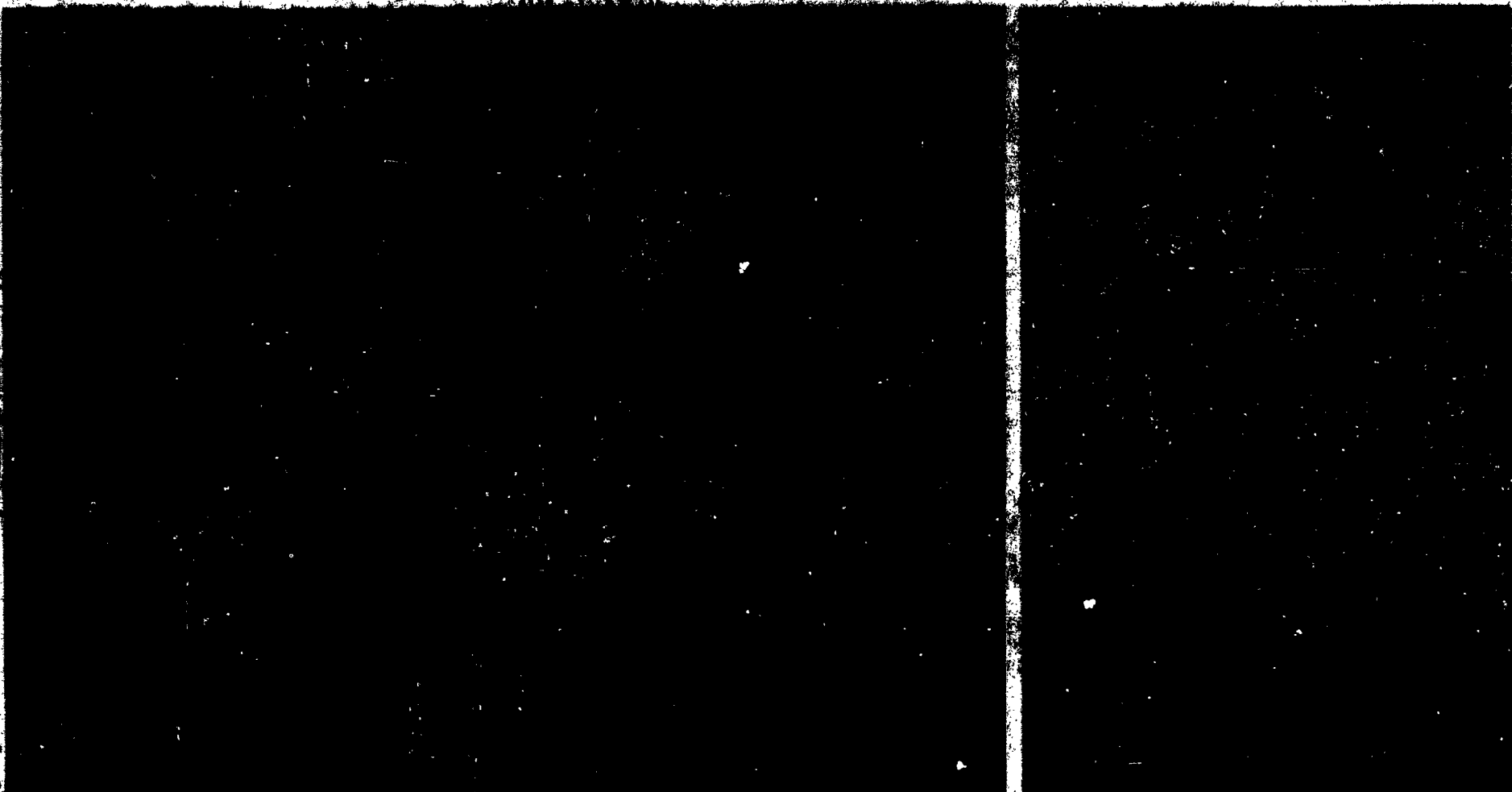


Seventh Ward Religious Art Exhibit

Behind the program is Mrs. Josephine M. Dolan who has organized a team of volunteer artists to staff her art center — which is also her home at 145 William St.

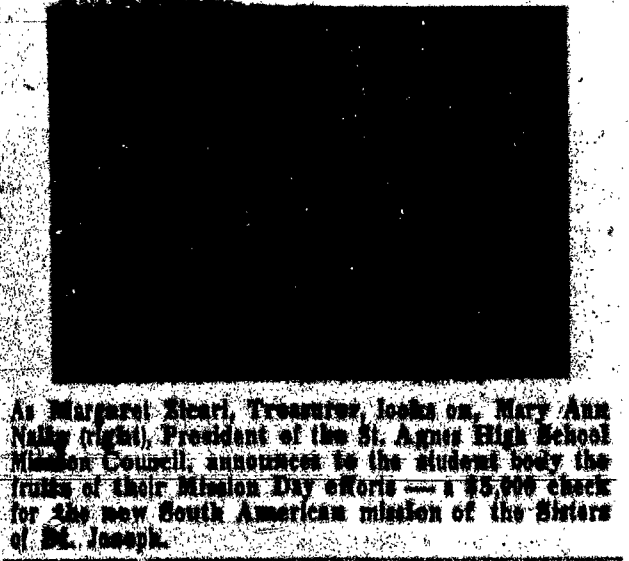
"We have 45 children in the center now and they're only a fraction of all we'd like to have," Dolan said.

What does the center need? "Everything — money, people, materials," replied Dolan.

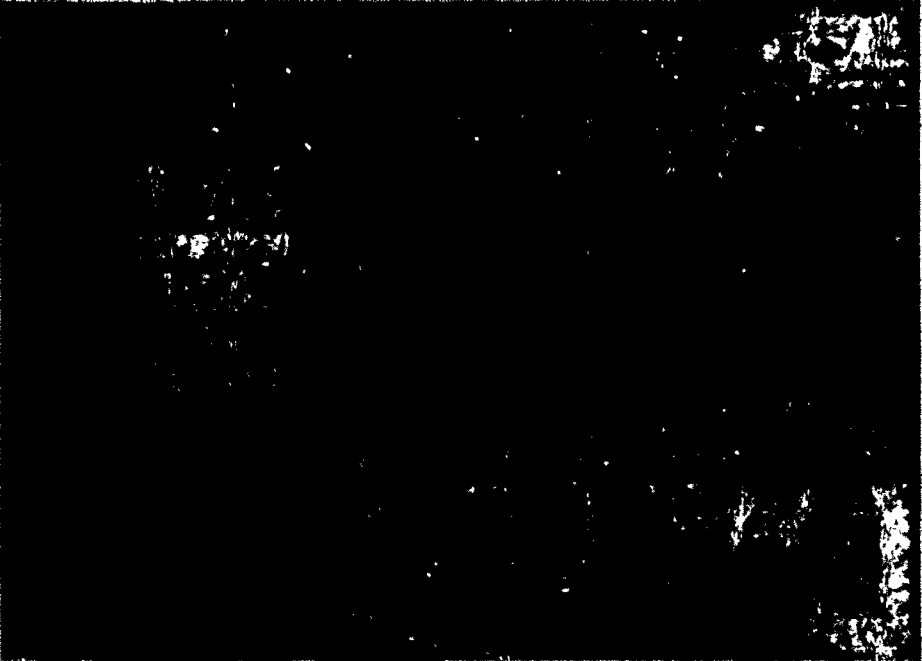

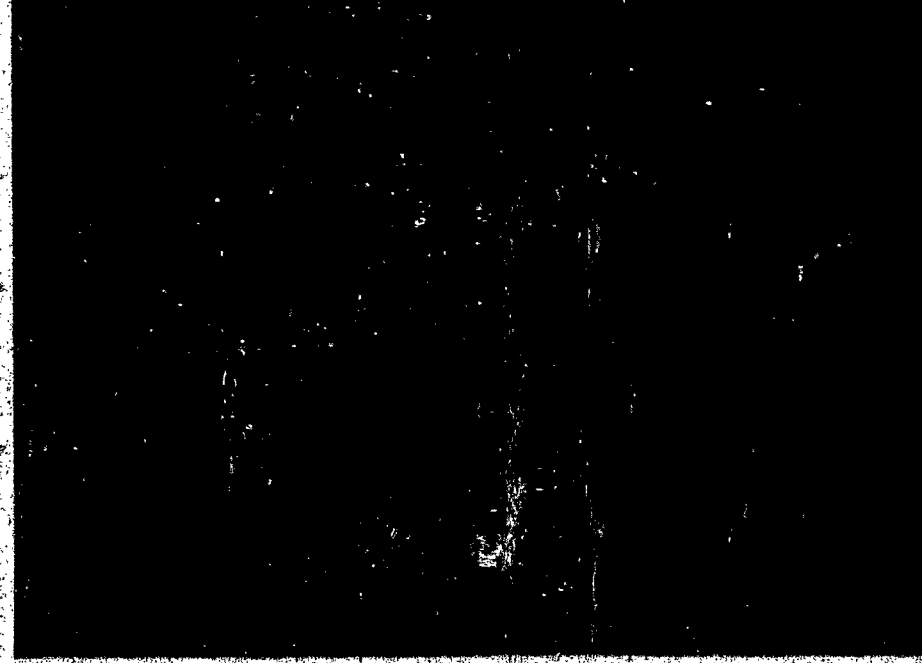
