Kathleen d'Olier Rites, Ex-Director Charities

Tribute to Miss Kathleen d'Olier who for more than 30 years served in an executive capacity in Rochester Catholic Charities was paid at the Solemn Funeral Mass, Friday, Oct. 9 in St. Augustine's Church.

Miss d'Olier, 81, of Thurston Road was formerly executive secretary, Rochester Catholic Family Center died Oct. 6, 1964.

With the Charities she was director of personnel and work of the Catholic Family Center, formerly the Family and Child Services Division of the Charities.

The Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by Rt. Rev. Arthur E. Madigan (sic) at 10:30 a.m. at St. Augustine's Church.

After World War II on a leave of absence she served in Athens, Greece, as director of the Junior Red Cross and established the first school of nursing in Greece.

On a second leave from Catholic Charities, Miss d'Olier went to Puerto Rico under auspices of the American Red Cross to organize the first public health nursing program. She established infant welfare and pre-natal centers in various Puerto Rican towns and obtained scholarships for the first Puerto Ricans ever to attend schools of social work.

Her career included membership on President Herbert Hoover's 1930 White House Conference on Children. For 21 years she served on the board of directors of the Council of Social Agencies in Rochester and was a member of American Association of Social Workers, 23 years.

Surviving is one sister, Mrs. Luel (Marie) Johnson, one niece, Mrs. Lewis (Ethel) Deutsch; one nephew, Walter W. Tribney of Atlanta, Ga.; two granddaughters, Mrs. Edward (Anne) Bruns, Miss Patti Trimb; two grandnephews, Louis T. Deutsch III and John T. Deutsch.
