

# Hindus Protest Eucharist Rally

Bombay — (NC) — Hindu religious parties are planning to stage "huge demonstrations" against the 38th International Eucharistic Congress to be held here (Nov. 28-Dec. 6) and the exposition in Goa of the Body of St. Francis Xavier, according to reports here.

Reports say that the right-wing Hindu parties—the Mahasabha and Jana Sangh (People's League)—will join in demonstrations to protest against "the pitiable helplessness of the state government (of Maharashtra) regarding the acute food shortage . . . and its unwarranted enthusiasm for the Catholic congress."

The Jana Sangh party declared through an article in its official paper that if India allows the congress to be held on its soil, "we will definitely be looked down upon by our Asian and African friends and our country's prestige will reach a new low."

The paper said that some Maharashtra state ministers have "become uneasy over the situation and are trying to persuade the chief minister to get the congress postponed."

However, it is recalled that Chief Minister V.P. Naik promised all assistance to the congress when he met the Congress Host Committee recently in Bombay.

Valerian Cardinal Gracias of Bombay called at a recent press conference to the charge that the congress will worsen the Bombay food situation. He affirmed that "there is no question whatsoever of the congress participants feasting while the citizens of Bombay starve . . . On the contrary, if there is a general food shortage the congress delegates will tighten their belts along with the public of Bombay."

The cardinal pointed out that both the central Indian and state governments are taking measures to ensure that requirements of congress visitors do not affect normal food supplies in Bombay. The Maharashtra government is arranging for additional food for the congress.

## Vatican Buys Jordan Land

Jerusalem — (RNS) — An announcement that the Apostolic Delegation intends to purchase a large plot of land in the Jordanian sector of Jerusalem caused wide speculation in both Israel and Jordan.

A Roman Catholic spokesman denied vigorously one report that the plot would be used to build a "papal palace" where Popes could reside during visits to the Holy Land.

He said the land would be used to construct a home and school for deaf mute children, under Pontifical auspices.

Another rumor tried to associate the project acquisition with the ecumenical center proposed recently by Pope Paul VI to study Christian and non-Christian religions.

## Nocturnal Men Set Holy Hour

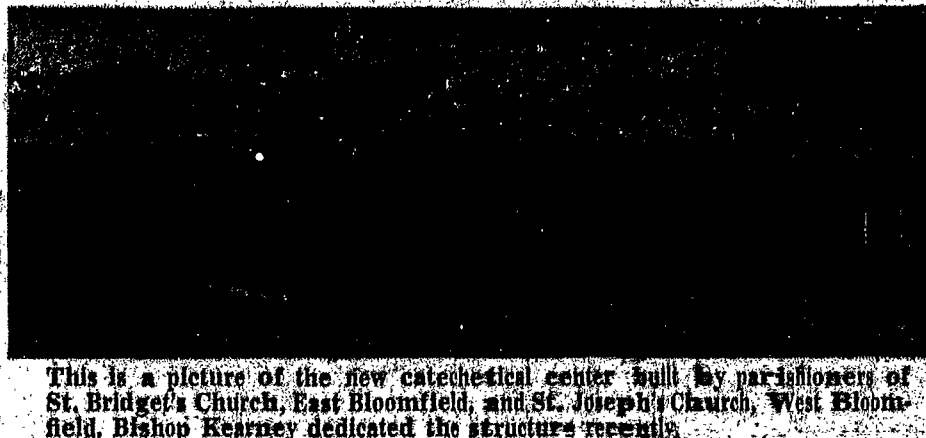
