High School Retreat To Open In Auburn

Auburn—The annual retreat for Catholic students in the Auburn Public High School will begin Sunday, October 25, at St. Mary's Church and continue each evening to Wednesday, Oct. 28.

Father Gerard B. McCormick of the Congregation of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, will preach the retreat services and be available for counseling during the days of the retreat.

Services will be at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Monday and Tuesday with Mass at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday followed by a supper at 6 p.m. in Lyceum Hall.

Father McCormick is a native of New York City and he received his elementary and high school education in the New York Catholic School system. After attending the Oblate Preparatory Seminary in Buffalo, N. Y., he entered the Novitiate of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate in Tewksbury, Massachusetts. After the completion of his Novitiate he took his First Vows and then pursued his philosophical and theological studies at the Oblate College in Washington, D.C. He was ordained to the Priesthood in 1947.

Shortly after his ordination, Father McCormick was assigned to one of the many Oblate mission fields in Sao Paulo, Brazil, South America, where he labored for the next five years.

Upon his return to the United States in 1952 he was assigned to the Oblate Mission Band and for the past twelve years he has been preaching missions and retreats throughout the eastern section of the country.

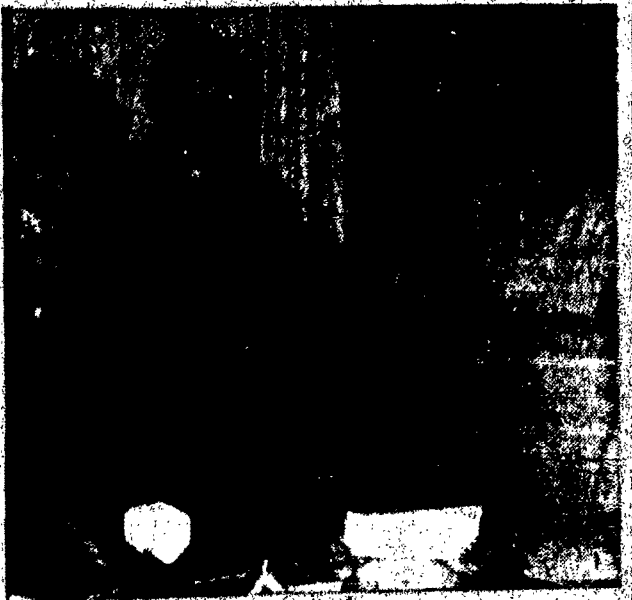
