Notre Dame Highlights

More than 170 tenth-grade students will take the three-hour National Educational Development Tests (NEDT) Saturday, Nov. 7, according to Sister Mary Declan, principal.

"The NEDT battery," she said, "is a series of tests in English, social studies, mathematics, natural sciences, and word usage, which have been designed to measure each student's ability to apply basic learning skills rather than his ability to memorize particular facts or specific subject matter. They have been used at Notre Dame since 1952 as a help to students, parents, and teachers in identifying strengths and weaknesses in each student's educational development and in making a realistic appraisal of his educational and vocational objectives," Sister Mary Declan said.

Batavia Topples Notre Dame 11

Notre Dame, after holding Batavia's highscoring offense at bay for three quarters, was the victim of a fourth-down desperation pass which gained 42 yards for the Blue Devils. With only 3 minutes, 25 seconds left in the game, Batavia kept reminding everyone at N.D. stadium that Halloween is a night when a trick, not a treat, should be expected. The final score was 17-7 in the visitors' favor.

Batavia's two fine runners, Pat Woodling and Bill Rosejer, rolled up most of their team's 180 yards rushing. Big Mike Malone, twice an all-city tackle, played fullback for the Crusaders for the first time since his freshman year, and gained 61 yards in 10 carries. The Crusaders' touchdown resulted from Tom Kondak's recovery of a fumble and Joe Cascio's eventual six-yard scamper. Jim Holleran, N.D. center, provided much of the blocking for Malone's plunges into the middle of the line.

The loss dropped the Crusaders' record to 4-3, the same as crosstown rival E.F.A., against whom N.D. will play its final game next week at its home stadium.

This game looms as the largest for both teams. Besides being Notre Dame's homecoming night, the mythical title of city champions will be decided by the encounter. Both teams have defeated Batavia by big scores and seem to be evenly matched. The big men in the E.F.A. line up are Dom Rainey, quarterback and excellent passer, and Fred Greene, probably the finest man on the field who will be the chief target for Rainey. The Academy Line backs teamed with Fred Hughes and Paul Cadek who will try to stop N.D.'s ground game.

The Crusader line is somewhat uncertain. Mike Malone may play fullback or tackle. The Crusader forward walk may feel the loss of Malone especially on pass protection. Fullback

McCarthy and Mrs. William J. Kierman will be co-chairmen.
