

## New St. John's Nears Completion

Nearly two hundred youngsters received their First Holy Communion Saturday morning in the first rite in newly completed St. John's Church in the Town of Greece.

The striking new structure — which has prompted much curiosity as workmen toiled on it — will probably be completed by the end of the year.

Parishioners will attend Mass there beginning this Sunday and Monsignor James C. McAniff will confer the sacrament of Confirmation in a 4 p.m. ceremony.

## Retired Couple Aid Teenagers

New York (NC)—For many couples, the "golden years" of retirement offer little more than inactivity. But that's not the case with Mr. and Mrs. John Roughan, who have found themselves with their most challenging task.

The Roughans have taken on the work of caring for seven of New York's troubled and neglected teenage boys.

It all began when the Roughans learned that the Brothers of the Christian Schools who run Lincoln Hall, a residential school for delinquent boys in Lincolnville, N.Y., were having difficulty locating house parents to staff residences for boys in Queens.

With a little encouragement and persuasion, the Roughans decided to give it a try. They were assigned to staff a modern home in a middle-class residential neighborhood in Flushing at a starting salary of \$6,400 plus room and board. Overnight, they became parents to seven boys.

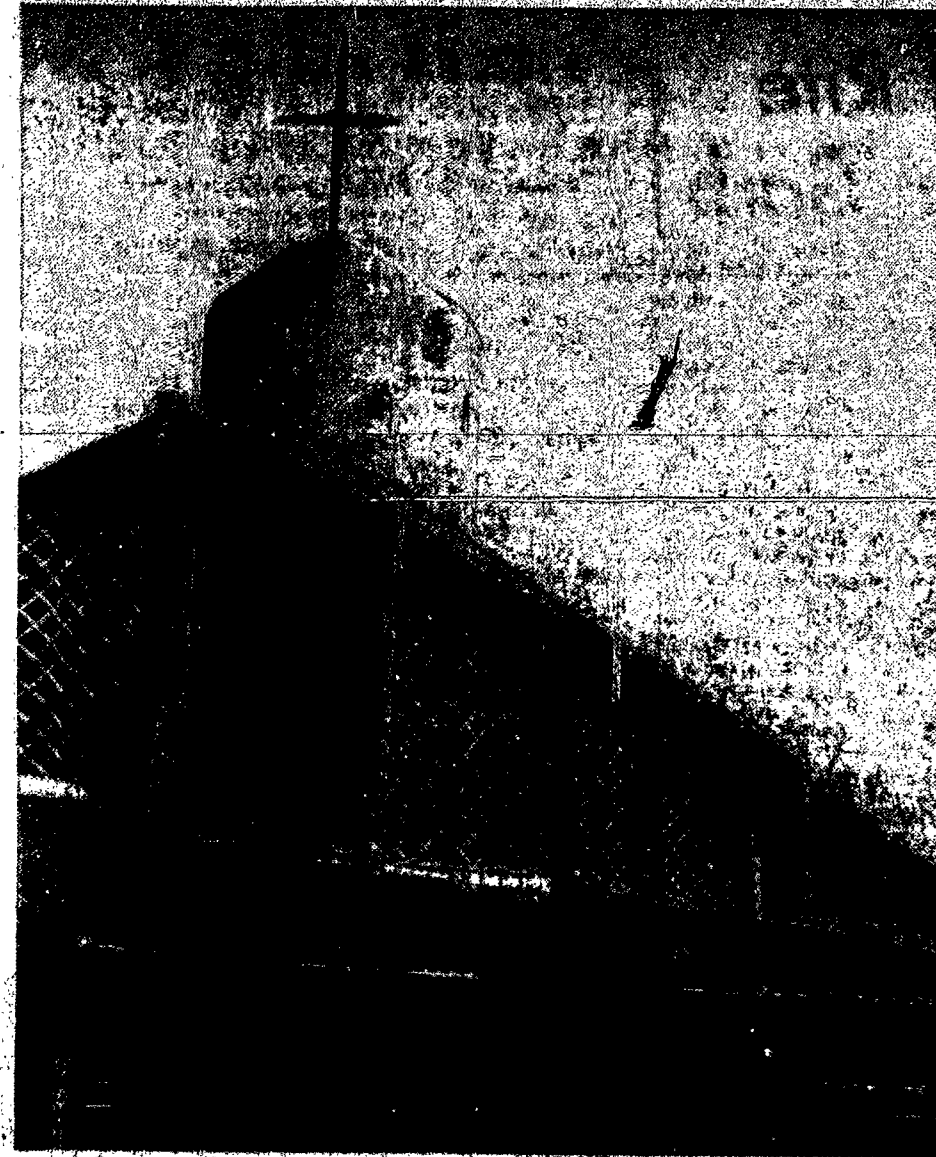
John and Molly swung quickly into the chores and responsibilities. Molly took over preparation of meals and care of the home while John took on supervision of the boys' day-to-day routine of school and play.

Soon they began to run the home and care for the boys as if they were their own children. Any apprehension or fears they had vanished in their preoccupation with caring for a family again.

"Boys will be boys," says John "and these are really no different from any other boys in New York today. Once they learn you are honest with them, they'll be honest with you. I really don't have any serious chores assigned to him, he's on his way."

## No Repeal Of Racial Justice

Los Angeles (NC)—James Francis Cardinal McIntyre has declared that repeal of California's fair housing law "does not repeal the serious moral obligation of all persons to avoid racial discrimination and segregation."

The Archbishop of Los Angeles called this a "moral duty concerning civil rights, derived from the God-given dignity of all men regardless of race or color."

California voters on Nov. 3 approved a constitutional amendment known as Proposition 13 which repealed the state's existing fair housing legislation and barred such laws in the future.

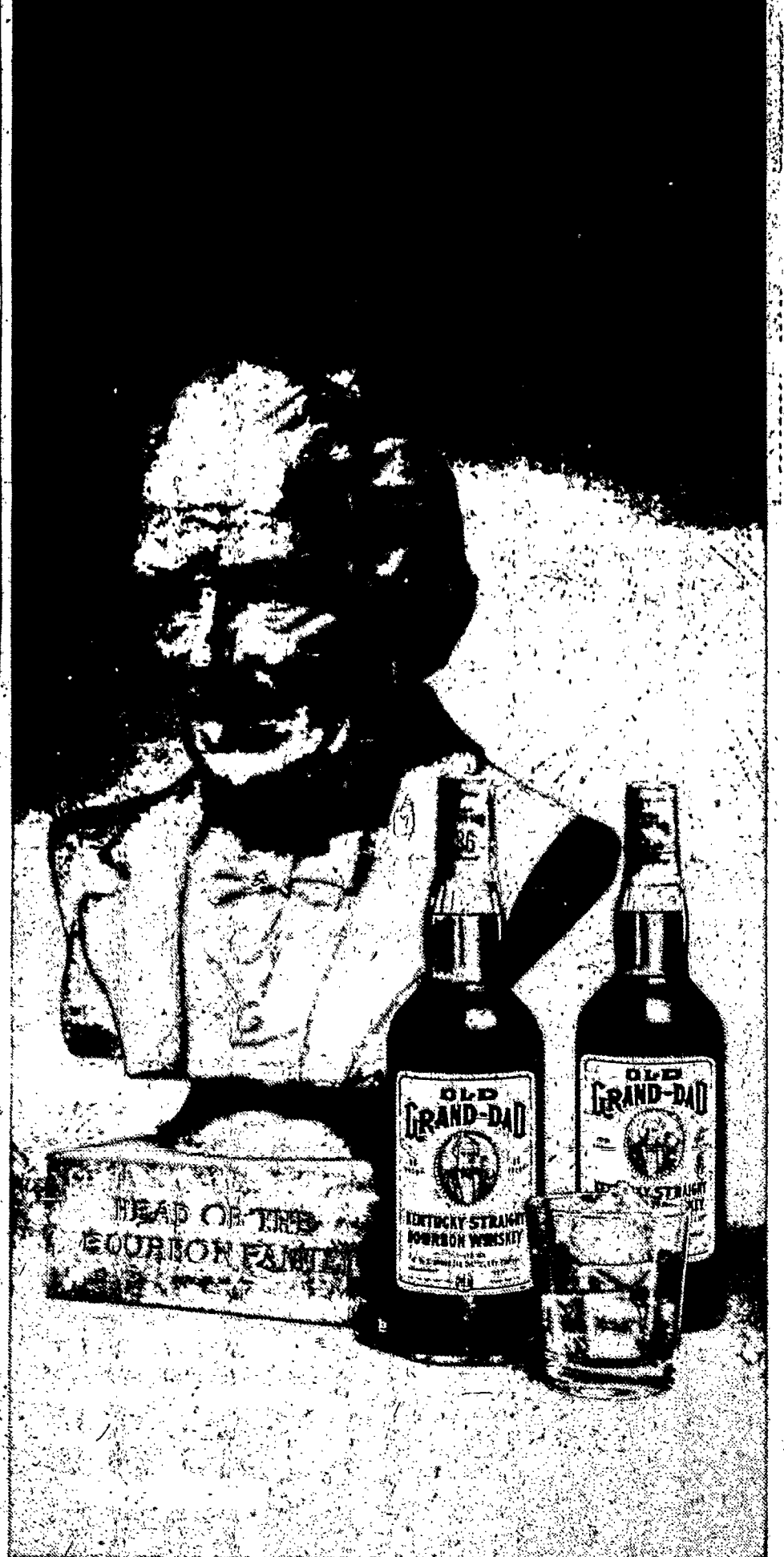
Many civic and religious groups in the state had worked for defeat of the amendment, which was strongly backed by the California Real Estate Association.

A number of individual Catholic bishops in California endorsed fair housing legislation before the vote and called for defeat of Proposition 13. And all the state's bishops joined in a pre-vote statement condemning racial bias.

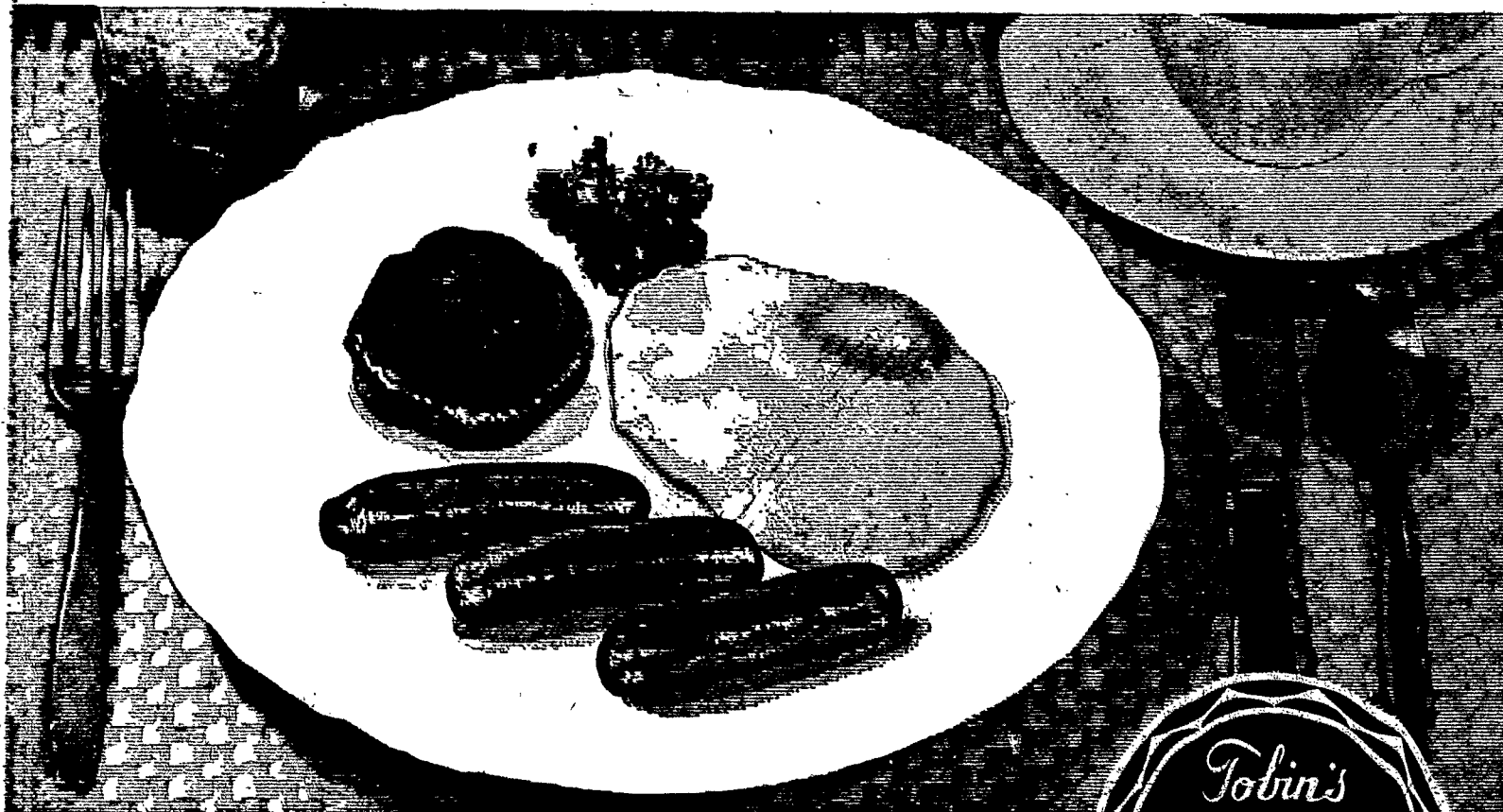

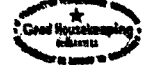
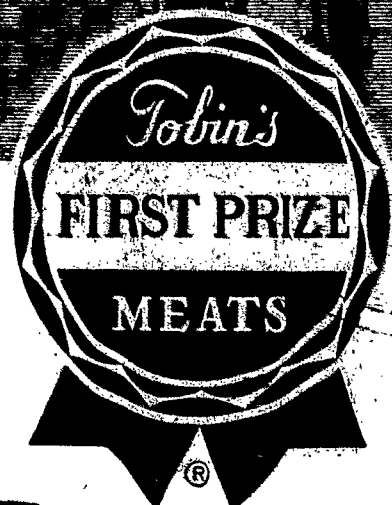
