N.D. got a break early in the first quarter when a bad snap from Academy's center resulted in a big loss on an attempted punt. The Crusaders however, were unable to capitalize and lost the ball on a fumble.

Academy, although moving the ball well, was unable to score until late in the second quarter. The Crusaders appeared to have the game tied up when Fred Greene fumbled on the E.F.A. 32 and Mike Malone picked up the loose ball and ran for an apparent score. However, the whistle had already been blown.

Numerous illegal procedure penalties called against ND balked the Crusaders several times.

Academy's second touchdown came right after the second half began. Dick Salmon was hit hard and fumbled. The loose ball was picked up and returned for a TD.

The Crusaders were unable to stop the E.F.A. ground game and the Blue Devils worked out 68 yards for a score.
