### Divine Word Students Hear India Missioner

Rev. Gerard Hofstee, S.V.D., a Divine Word Missioner from India, spoke to the student body at St. Michael's Divine Word Seminary at Conesus on Monday evening Nov. 9.

FATHER HOFSTEE, originally of Mt. Vernon, Washington, was ordained to the priesthood in 1935 and was sent to India in that same year. Since then he has remained in India, except for short visits to the States.

In the city of Khandwa, located in the north central state of Madhya Pradesh, Father Hofstee cares for a parish, a school, an orphanage, and the lepers of the city.

The orphanage was begun because of the number of girl babies found abandoned at birth. He cares for eighty orphans.

In a girls' boarding school, with room for 150 girls, he is establishing education for girls. Before this, education was considered neither necessary nor useful for girls in this section of India.

Now he is building a two-story dormitory addition in a characteristic tone he spoke of the "hopeless optimism" of his work in Khandwa and of a "5000 Year Plan" for the Christianization of India.

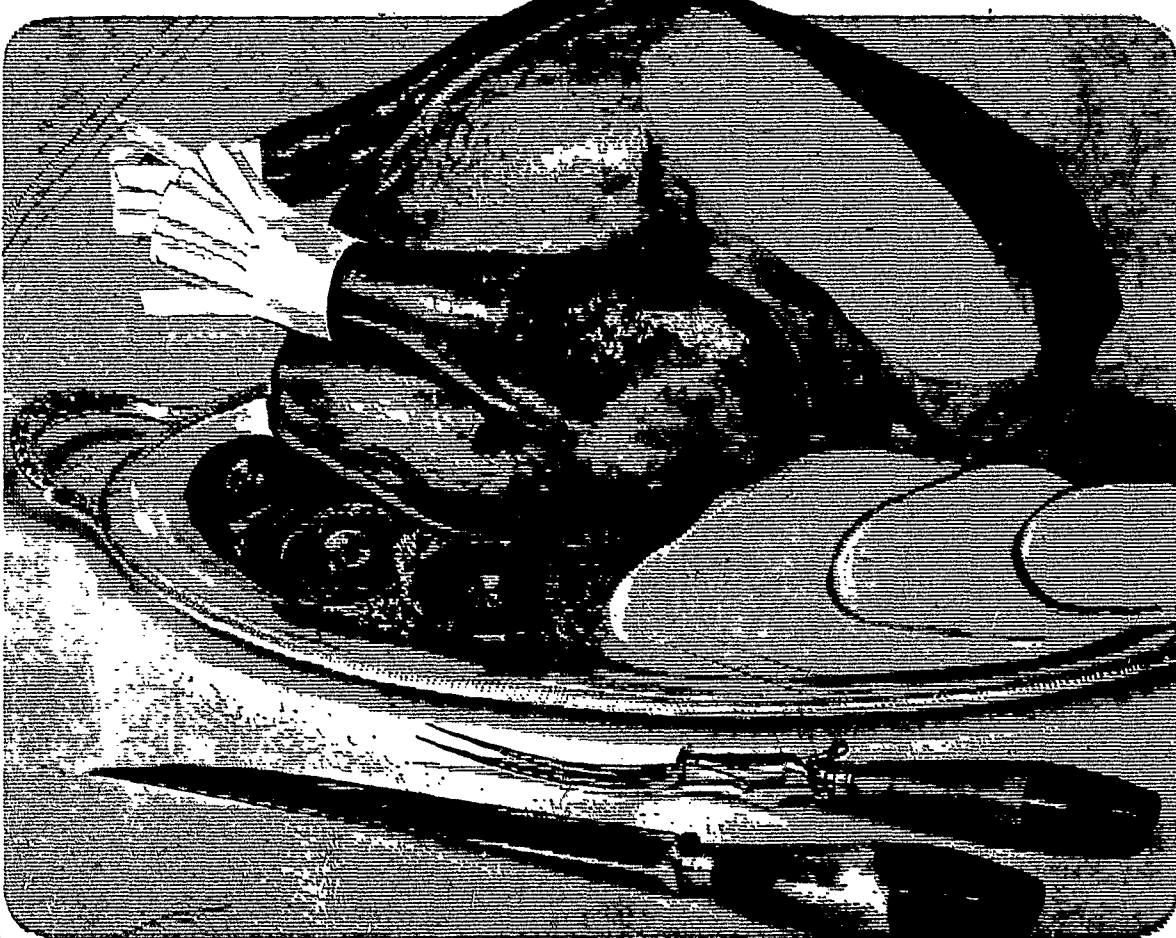
