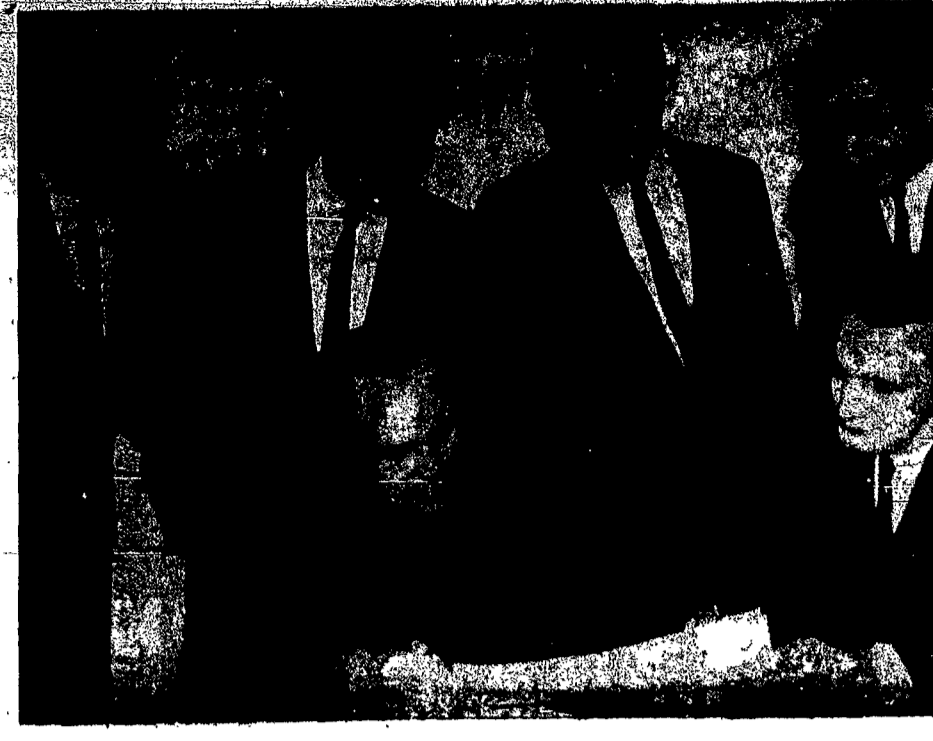




### Civics Club Receives Charter
