A shrine in honor of the Sacred Heart featuring the theme "Love Thy Neighbor" was erected by Mrs. Richard Taber.

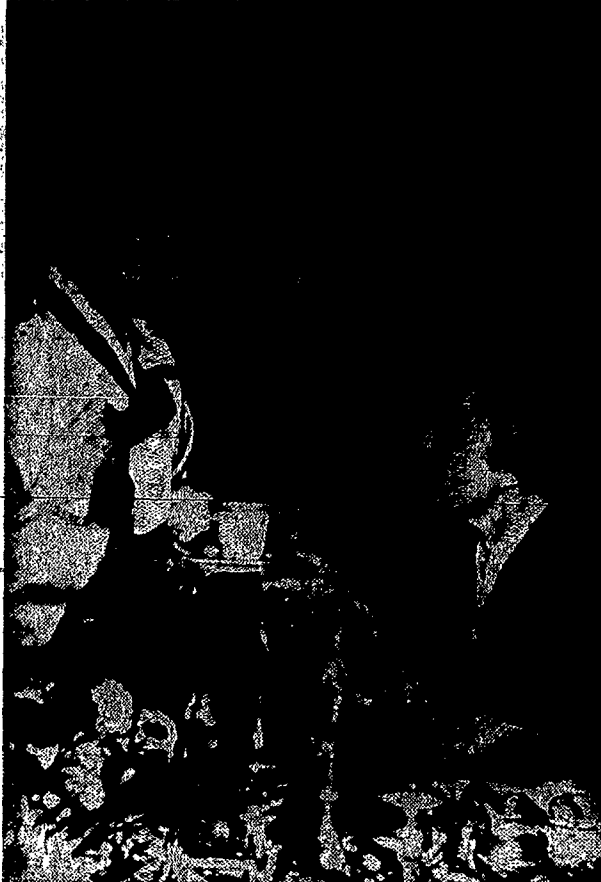

Vatican City — (NC) — Albert Cardinal Meyer of Chicago has been appointed a member of the Congregation of the Holy Office, the Roman congregation which guards Catholic faith and morals.

Named to the same body by Pope Paul VI were Luigi Cardinal Traglia, pro-vice general for Rome, and Joseph Cardinal Lefebvre of Bourges, France.

Cardinal Meyer remains Archbishop of Chicago and will not be required to leave his See and live in Rome in his new capacity.

Fr. Bauer Publishes New Religion Manual

"Instant Theology" is the title of a new manual by Father E. Charles Bauer, Catholic chaplain of the Newark State School for the Mentally Retarded. Rather than the usual textbook commentary...

The outlines can well serve as a handy review, a quick reference and an easy memory aid to those already instructed in the faith.

The 88 page manual is published in a spiral binding by The Catholic Information Society and will be available soon at Trant's in Rochester.

All proceeds from the sale of the book, according to Father Bauer, will be used for the sole purpose of the construction of a chapel for the Catholic patients at the Newark State School for the mentally retarded.

Father Bauer has also published a booklet, "Retarded Children are People," written to acquaint the public with the problem of retarded children and the work being done at the Newark State School.

This dedicated chaplain and priest-author is already working on two more texts, by which he hopes to finance a Catholic chapel for his little flock in Newark.

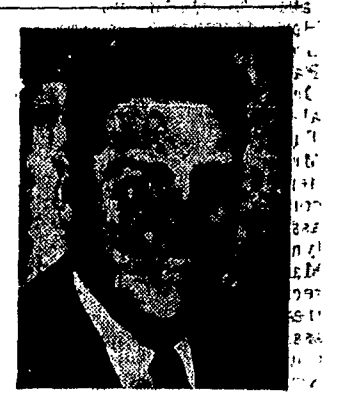
