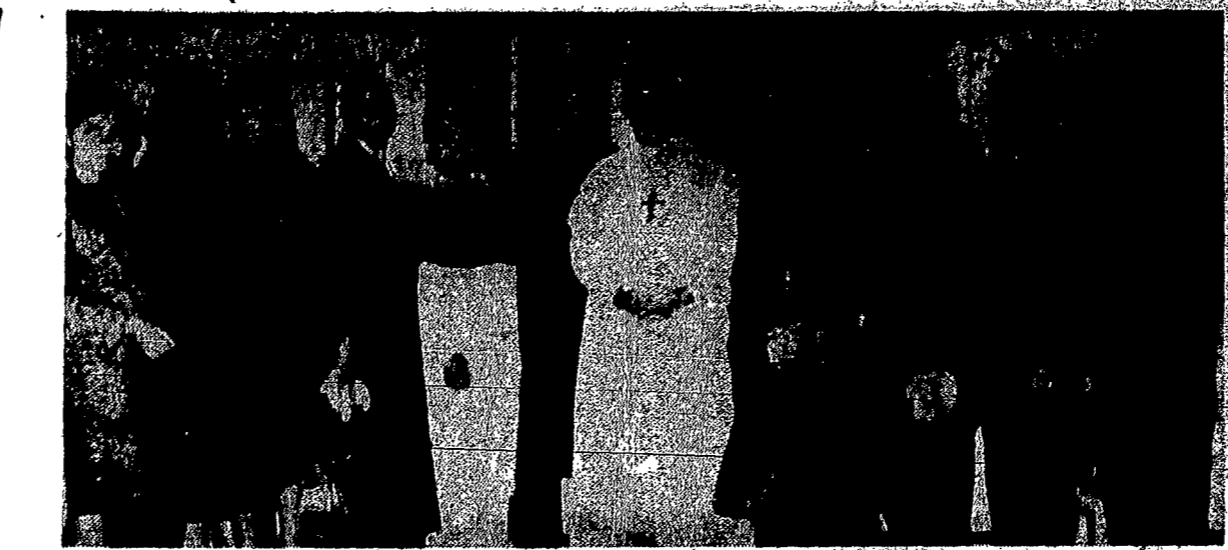

Old Friendships Renewed On South America Trip

An interest in the problems of Negroes prompted a much traveled Rochester couple, Mr. and Mrs. Samuel B. Gillette to journey to South America early this Fall.

MR. AND MRS. Gillette, now retired and residing in Victor had a two-fold reason for making the trip which was to be their second out of the country in three years. As with their trip to Europe three years ago, they planned to renew acquaintances with students they had befriended through the International Friendship Council of Rochester.

During the seven years they were active in the Friendship Council, Mr. and Mrs. Gillette had on a number of occasions, entertained students from Nigeria and Jamaica.

Leaving New York City by jet on Aug. 15, the party of eleven, under the guidance of the Rt. Rev. Norbert George of New York City, flew to Bogota, Colombia.

From Bogota, the group flew to Cartagena, Colombia, the site of St. Peter Claver Church, named after the Jesuit saint who ministered to the slaves in Cartagena. The Gillettes were received by the archbishop.

Next on their itinerary was a stop in Quito, Ecuador and then to Lima, Peru. Here the Gillettes found many places abounding in history of St. Peter Claver and St. Martin de Porres, the mulatto Dominican who spent much of his lifetime working for the poor.
