McQuaid Jesuit High, with victory number one already under its belt, goes after number two tonight (Fri. 11/27) as it takes on Irondequoit in the opening half of a scholastic doubleheader at the War Memorial.

Game time is 7 p.m. In the second game, two of the county league's closest rivals, East Rochester and Brockport, will be paired off. For all except McQuaid, it will be the season's opener, and a good-sized holiday crowd is in prospect.

McQuaid will send its veteran cast, which came through on Wednesday at Batavia, against Irondequoit five that has two seasoned men back from last season's 17-4 Section V semi-finals. Irondequoit will rely on Vandy Bollinger and Larry Zink to lead a squad that has good all-around size.
